

So great to see you at the Secretary's swearing-in.




I have no dog in this fight. Neither of these guys is a personal

How to Succeed in the Networked Century

A large part of the reason Barack20Obama defeated Hillary Clinton in last year's Democratic primary can be reduced to the fact that he mobilized his bottom-up network better than she mobilized her top-down one. So it was notable that even before formally taking over the State Department, Clinton named Anne-Marie Slaughter, Dean of Princeton's Woodrow Wilson School, to lead the department's internal think tank, the Policy Planning Staff. Slaughter has been a vocal advocate of viewing the world through a network lens. Most recently, her article in the current issue of Foreign Affairs, "America's Edge: Power in the Networked Century," argues that America's best future lies in positioning itself as the world's most networked nation, the hub of information, ideas, and resources flowing though the global economy

I couldn't agree more, having argued here that the White House, rather than focusing on illusory conflicts of interest involving the Clinton Foundation, should be encouraging the State Department to steal what they can from the Clinton Global Initiative and similar groups -- organizations that facilitate innovation by acting as the network broker between innovators, governments, and private enterprise. Slaughter's article extends this argument to important policy arenas, but in the process raises an important issue that will need to be addressed if networks are to play a substantial role in securing America's place in the world.

As Slaughter points=2 0out, the ability to innovate, seize opportunity, and marshal resources to advance an agenda boils down to managing and orchestrating networks. Slaughter cites a number of examples of what can be achieved through what is sometimes called "network entrepreneurship": multinational collaboration regarding the financial crisis; the success of a coalition of NGOs in working to ban the use of land mines; and an improved response to public health threats through a network established by the Centers for Disease Control. Unfortunately, these success stories are more the exception than the rule. The fact is that even in the upper echelons of decision-making, we are notoriously poor at managing and orchestrating networks. Indeed,

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immeasurable opportunities are lost and efforts needlessly duplicated in areas ranging from global health to business development because our network skills are rooted in a less complex, more hierarchical, top-down past. For the United States to position itself as the most powerful player in "the networked century," those capabilities will have to evolve significantly. That will require two broad developments:

First, we need to take a more holistic, dynamic view of the people within our -- and everyone else's -- networks. We tend to think of people in terms of three attributes: their job title, where they have worked, and where they were educated. In an earlier time, this may have been sufficient to understand a person's place in a network and to fairly well guess their skills, who they might be connected to, and what their priorities might be. In today's more fluid world, however, people cross borders, change careers, and recast alliances much more readily, each stage in their trajectory potentially expanding and reshaping their network -- and certainly reshaping who they are and what they have to offer.

This is the basis of Slaughter's contention that we need to view immigrant communities and the emerging generation of "First Globals" (18- to 29-year-old Americans who are inclined to live and study abroad in greater numbers than their predecessors) as potential links to new markets and opportunities around the globe. But in order to do this, you need to know the various facets of a person's life -- where they've lived, what they're interested in personally and professionally, who their mentors have been and so on. In a networked world powered more on personal initiative, skill sets and relationships than hierarchical position, a person's job title and other résumé details no longer are as reliable indicators of a person's potential to effect change in the global network and the resources he or she commands.

Second, we need to become more methodical and data driven in our approach to networks. Professional sports like baseball and basketball have been in the midst of a data revolution that is reshaping how players are evaluated. Instead of relying merely on received wisdom and personal experience, coaches and scouts are using reams of data that are questioning old assumptions about what makes for a star player, and using that insight to build teams. (So it was that Nate Silver, whose [political web site](#) has set new standards for election forecasting, actually began as a baseball analyst.) There needs to be a similar data revolution in networks. Rather than manage them in an ad hoc fashion with instinct and imperfect memories as we do now, we need to develop and use analytical tools that will allow us to track more complex networks, see patterns over time, and identify key players who act as the gateway to different clusters of ideas, resources, and support. Many components of these analytical tools exist, but they need to be further developed and brought into the mainstream.

Anne-Marie Slaughter is correct to see network entrepreneurship as the critical capability for the twenty-first century, in the same way that trade (itself a specialized example of network entrepreneurship) was in the mercantile period. But maintaining oneself as a trading power required more than just ships and goods. It also required better navigation tools, most notably the discovery of a reliable means of measuring the longitude of ships at sea. The old method of dead reckoning -- and the risks it brought of inefficient routing if not catastrophic shipwreck -- was no longer acceptable. Solving the problem was considered so critical to the national interest that Britain established the Longitude Prize to spur on a solution.

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We don't need a similar "Network Prize"; many of the tools we need to understand networks already exist. Instead, we need public and private-sector decision makers to see that competitive advantage in the networked century goes to those who develop the most sophistication in using those tools and the networks they illuminate.

America's Edge: Power in the Networked Century

Summary: The United States' unique ability to capitalize on connectivity will make the twenty-first century an American century.

ANNE-MARIE SLAUGHTER is Dean of the Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs and Bert G. Kerstetter '66 University Professor of Politics and International Affairs at Princeton University.

We live in a networked world. War is networked: the power of terrorists and the militaries that would defeat them depend on small, mobile groups of warriors connected to one another and to intelligence, communications,

and support networks. Diplomacy is networked: managing international crises -- from SARS to climate change -- requires mobilizing international networks of public and private actors. Business is networked: every CEO advice manual published in the past decade has focused on the shift from the vertical world of hierarchy to the horizontal world of networks. Media are networked: online blogs and other forms of participatory media depend on contributions from readers to create a vast, networked conversation. Society is networked: the world of MySpace is creating a global world of "OurSpace," linking hundreds of millions of individuals across continents. Even religion is networked: as the pastor Rick Warren has argued, "The only thing big enough to solve the problems of spiritual emptiness, selfish leadership, poverty, disease, and ignorance is the network of millions of churches all around the world."

In this world, the measure of power is connectedness. Almost 30 years ago, the psychologist Carol Gilligan wrote about differences between the genders in their modes of thinking. She observed that men tend to see the world as made up of hierarchies of power and seek to get to the top, whereas women tend to see the world as containing webs of relationships and seek to move to the center. Gilligan's observations may be a function of nurture rather than nature; regardless, the two lenses she identified capture the differences between the twentieth-century and the twenty-first-century worlds.

The twentieth-century world was, at least in terms of geopolitics, a billiard-ball world, described by the political scientist Arnold Wolfers as a system of self-contained states colliding with one another. The results of these collisions were determined by military and economic power. This world still exists today. Russia invades Georgia, Iran seeks nuclear weapons, the United States strengthens its ties with India as a hedge against a rising China. This is what Fareed Zakaria, the editor of Newsweek International, has dubbed "the post-American world," in which the rise of new global powers inevitably means the relative decline of U.S. influence. The emerging networked world of the twenty-first century, however, exists above the state, below the state, and through the state. In this world, the state with the most connections will be the central player, able to set the global agenda and unlock innovation and sustainable growth. Here, the United States has a clear and sustainable edge.

THE HORIZON OF HOPE

The United States' advantage is rooted in demography, geography, and culture. The United States has a relatively small population, only 20-30 percent of the size of China's or India's. Having fewer people will make it much easier for the United States to develop and profit from new energy technologies. At the same time, the heterogeneity of the U.S. population will allow Washington to extend its global reach. To this end, the United States should see its immigrants as living links back to their home countries and encourage a two-way flow of people, products, and ideas.

The United States is the anchor of the Atlantic hemisphere, a broadly defined area that includes Africa, the Americas, and Europe. The leading countries in the Atlantic hemisphere are more peaceful, stable, and economically diversified than those in the Asian hemisphere. At the same time, however, the United States is a pivotal power, able to profit simultaneously from its position in the Atlantic hemisphere and from its deep ties to the Asian hemisphere. The Atlantic and Pacific Oceans have long protected the United States from invasion and political interference. Soon, they will shield it from conflicts brought about by climate change, just as they are already reducing the amount of pollutants that head its way. The United States has a relatively horizontal social structure -- albeit one that has become more hierarchical with the growth of income inequality -- as well as a culture of entrepreneurship and innovation. These traits are great advantages in a global economy increasingly driven by networked clusters of the world's most creative people.

On January 20, 2009, Barack Obama will set about restoring the moral authority of the United States. The networked world provides a hopeful horizon. In this world, with the right policies, immigrants can be a source of jobs rather than a drain on resources, able to link their new home with markets and suppliers in their old homes. Businesses in the United States can orchestrate global networks of producers and suppliers. Consumers can buy locally, from revived local agricultural and customized small-business economies, and at the same time globally, from anywhere that can advertise online. The United States has the potential to be the most innovative and dynamic society anywhere in the world.

LIFE IN A NETWORKED WORLD

In 2000, Procter and Gamble made a decision that reinvented how the company would do business in the twenty-first century. Instead of closely guarding its secret recipes for everything from soaps to potato chips, Procter and Gamble chose to open up its patent portfolio, making virtually all its formulas available to anyone willing to pay a licensing fee. At the same time, it asked its top managers to bring in half of their ideas for new

products and services from outside the company. They now look to far-flung groups of inventors around the world and online, where innovators gather at sites such as InnoCentive, an auction Web site for ideas. Don Tapscott and Anthony Williams, the authors of *Wikinomics: How Mass Collaboration Changes Everything*, call businesses like InnoCentive "ideagoras," modern-day public squares that join people looking to sell their ideas with businesses seeking to buy them. In 2006, Samuel Palmisano, the head of IBM, predicted in these pages that corporations would move from being multinational, with small, self-replicated versions of themselves in every market, to being what he calls "globally integrated enterprises." Today, IBM funnels tasks to wherever they will be done best.

Consider the experience of Li and Fung, the world's largest and most successful export sourcing company. Its clients are retailers of virtually every kind of product known to man, or at least made by man. The job of Li and Fung is to identify suppliers from over 40 countries around the world and connect them in order to fill specific orders. The resulting networks must be fast, flexible, and able to work to a common high standard. According to William and Victor Fung, two of the current owners of the family business, the secret of sourcing is "orchestrating networks." It is the managerial equivalent of creating a system in which one can select a destination on a Paris metro map and see a possible route light up with a connecting web of differently colored lines -- except, of course, that riders at each station might have their own ideas about how best to travel. At first, these global webs may seem to be just the next generation of outsourcing. But something much deeper is going on. Outsourcing requires a central command that specifies precisely what and how much should be produced and then, through an established hierarchy, communicates those decisions to producers in multiple nations. In contrast, under a system of peer production, supply chains become "value webs," in which suppliers become partners and, instead of just supplying products, actually collaborate on their design. Boeing is a particularly striking example, given how it could be seen as the heart of old-style manufacturing. It has shifted from being simply an airplane manufacturer to being a "systems integrator," relying on a horizontal network of partners collaborating in real time. They share both risk and knowledge in order to achieve a higher level of performance. It is not simply a change in form but a change in culture. Hierarchy and control lose out to community, collaboration, and self-organization. At its core, a company can be quite small, often no more than a central node of leaders and manager-integrators. But with the right networks, it can reach anywhere. Innovators, factories, and service providers can be found. In this world, as Tapscott and Williams write, "only the connected will survive."

Nongovernmental organizations (NGOs), too, have realized the power of connections. An early example was the International Campaign to Ban Landmines, which began in 1991 as a coalition of six NGOs from North America and Europe. It eventually grew to include over 1,100 groups in some 60 countries, and with this breadth came clout. After it won the Nobel Peace Prize in 1997, the network successfully pushed for a global treaty banning the use of land mines (although China, Russia, and the United States, among others, have refused to sign it). NGOs pursuing other causes have followed suit. In 1995, a small group of human rights organizations began calling for the creation of an international criminal court to try war criminals. They succeeded in convincing governments to establish a permanent court in 1998. Today, the Coalition for the International Criminal Court includes over 2,000 organizations from every corner of the world, which are now working to expand the court's jurisdiction. More recently, a global alliance of NGOs has been instrumental in pushing for action to stop the ongoing violence in Darfur.

In each of these cases, NGOs gained leverage over otherwise reluctant states. They formed transnational networks that multiplied their lobbying power and put their message on the agendas of international institutions. As Francis Sejersted, then chair of the Nobel Committee, noted when he recognized the land-mine campaign, "The mobilisation and focusing of broad popular involvement which we have witnessed bears promise that goes beyond the present issue. It appears to have established a pattern for how to realise political aims at the global level."

Governments have been slower to understand twenty-first-century challenges and to reform themselves accordingly, but they, too, are gradually moving toward a more networked structure. A report entitled *The Embassy of the Future*, issued by the Center for Strategic and International Studies in 2007, calls for U.S. diplomats to be "decentralized, flexible, and mobile," as well as "connected, responsive, and informed." U.S. embassy staff would have a more "distributed presence," both virtually and physically, if they worked at multiple locations and with a wide range of different groups in their host countries.

Similarly, Julie Gerberding, director of the Centers for Disease Control, realized after the anthrax scare in 2001 and the SARS crisis in 2002 that the CDC needed to create a network of public and private actors from around

the world. Managing this network would, in turn, require a much more flexible and horizontal organization at the CDC's headquarters, in Atlanta. Gerberding was expected to get results but lacked the authority necessary to produce them. For Gerberding, the solution was to find partners around the world and to connect them in ways that would allow for the creation and sharing of knowledge during a crisis. Many judges and government regulators have had a similar insight. Bankruptcy judges, for example, now communicate with one another around the world, signing agreements to manage together the bankruptcies of multinational corporations. The current financial crisis could have been even worse if the world's central bankers had not already been connected and able to coordinate their actions.

Power can also flow from connections across different sectors. In his book *Superclass: The Global Power Elite and the World They Are Making*, David Rothkopf explains how leaders connect across different power structures, from the worlds of business and finance to those of politics and the arts. "In fact," he writes, "such linkages are as distinguishing a characteristic of the superclass as wealth or individual position." In other words, it is connectivity, more than money or stature, that determines individual power. This dynamic can even extend to terrorist groups such as al Qaeda. John Robb, a former air force colonel and military strategist, has observed that Mohamed Atta was the leader of the 9/11 hijackers because, although no formal hierarchy existed in the group, "Atta had twenty-two connections to other people in the network, much more than any other, which gave him control of the operation."

The power that flows from this type of connectivity is not the power to impose outcomes. Networks are not directed and controlled as much as they are managed and orchestrated. Multiple players are integrated into a whole that is greater than the sum of its parts -- an orchestra that plays differently according to the vision of its conductor and the talent of individual musicians. Obama's team-based campaign, with its relatively flat structure and emphasis on individual organizers, is a model of the twenty-first century's management style.

Most important, networked power flows from the ability to make the maximum number of valuable connections. The next requirement is to have the knowledge and skills to harness that power to achieve a common purpose. The United States is already following this model in a few specific ways. In combating terrorism, it has been able to stop planned attacks thanks to a dense global network of law enforcement officers, counterterrorism officials, and intelligence agencies. The U.S. government dramatically improved its standing in the Muslim world due to its swift and effective relief effort in Asia following the December 2004 tsunami. It coordinated an emergency-response strategy among government agencies and aid workers in Australia, India, Japan, and the United States itself. More recently, when the global financial crisis hit this past fall, the United States first reached out to central banks around the world to coordinate a monetary response and then reached out to central banks in key emerging markets to make sure their foreign currency needs were being met.

From this vantage point, predictions of an Asian century -- such as those made by Kishore Mahbubani, a foreign policy scholar and dean of the Lee Kwan Yew School of Public Policy, in Singapore -- seem premature. Even Zakaria's argument about "the rise of the rest" takes on a different significance. If, in a networked world, the issue is no longer relative power but centrality in an increasingly dense global web, then the explosion of innovation and entrepreneurship occurring today will provide that many more points of possible connection. The twenty-first century looks increasingly like another American century -- although it will likely be a century of the Americas rather than of just America.

MORE PEOPLE, MORE PROBLEMS

Demography is often cited as the chief factor behind the relative decline of the West. China and India make up over a third of the world's population, while Europe and Japan are actually shrinking and the United States is suddenly a relatively small nation of 300 million. This argument, however, rests largely on assumptions formed in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries. Throughout most of human history, territory and population translated into military and economic power. Military power depended on the number of soldiers a state could put into the field, the amount of territory an enemy had to cross to conquer it, and the economy's ability to supply the state's army. Population size mattered for economic power because without trade a state needed a domestic market large enough for manufacturers and merchants to thrive. With trade, however, small mercantile nations such as the Netherlands and Portugal were able to punch far above their weight. In the nineteenth century, to increase their power, small countries expanded their territory through colonization. But by the twentieth century, as political unrest in the colonial world grew, the advantages of trading rather than ruling became increasingly clear. Although the United States and the Soviet Union, two great continental powers, dominated the second half of the twentieth century, the countries that grew the richest were often the smallest. In 2007, the ten countries with the highest per capita GDPs all had populations smaller than that of New York City, with one

notable exception: the United States.

In the twenty-first century, less is more. Domestic markets must be big enough to allow national firms to obtain a foothold so as to withstand international competition (although such markets can be obtained through free-trade areas and economic unions). But beyond this minimum, if trade barriers are low and transportation and communication are cheap, then size will be more of a burden than a benefit. When both markets and production are global, then productive members of every society will generate income across multiple societies. Business managers in one country can generate value by orchestrating a global and disparate network of researchers, designers, manufacturers, marketers, and distributors. It will remain the responsibility of government, however, to provide for the less productive members of society, namely, the elderly, the young, the disabled, and the unemployed -- think of them as national overhead costs. From this perspective, the 300 million citizens in the United States look much more manageable than the more than a billion in China or India.

A shrinking population can actually act as a catalyst for innovation. In China, the answer to many problems is simply to throw people at them -- both because people are the most available commodity and because the Chinese government needs to provide as many jobs as possible. In Japan, by contrast, the answer is to innovate. Nintendo, the Kyoto-based gaming giant, is bringing much of its manufacturing back to Japan from China and other parts of Asia. How can it possibly compete using high-cost Japanese labor? It will not have to -- its new factories are almost entirely automated, with only a handful of highly skilled employees needed to run them. This approach uses less energy, costs less, and guarantees a higher standard of living for the Japanese population. As the priority shifts from economic growth to sustainable growth, the formula of fewer people plus better and greener technology will look increasingly attractive.

Finally, size carries its own set of political challenges. Over the past four centuries, the arrow of history has pointed in the direction of national self-determination. Empires and multiethnic countries have steadily divided and subdivided into smaller units so that nations, or dominant ethnic groups, could govern themselves. Ninety years after Woodrow Wilson laid out his vision of self-determination for the Balkan states, the process continues in Kosovo. In many ways, the breakup of the Soviet Union was another round of the decolonization and self-determination movement that began in the 1940s. It continues today with the conflicts over Abkhazia and South Ossetia, as well as with the potential for conflict on the Crimean Peninsula and in eastern Ukraine. Much of China's 5,000-year history has been a saga of the country's splitting apart and being welded back together. The Chinese government, like the Indian government, legitimately fears that current pockets of instability could quickly translate into multiple secessionist movements.

The United States faces no threats to its essential unity, which has been forged by a political and cultural ideology of unity amid diversity. The principal alternative to this ideology is the solution employed by the European Union and the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN), in which individual states come together as larger economic and, gradually, quasi-political units. The most promising dimension of recent Chinese politics has been its adoption of a version of this solution with regard to Hong Kong and Macao -- and one day Beijing may apply this model to Taiwan.

The United States benefits not only from its limited population but also from who makes up that population. It has long attracted the world's most entrepreneurial, creative, and determined individuals. A vast mixing of cultures has created an atmosphere for a fruitful cross-fertilization and innovation. These arguments still hold. In San Francisco, for instance, a new municipal telephone help line advertises that it can talk with callers in over 150 languages. This diversity, and the creativity that it produces, is visible everywhere: in Hollywood movies, in American music, and at U.S. universities. At Princeton University this past fall, five of the six student award winners for the highest grade point averages had come from abroad: from China, Germany, Moldova, Slovenia, and Turkey.

In the nineteenth- and twentieth-century era of nation-states, the United States absorbed its immigrants and molded them into Americans, thereby creating the national cohesion necessary to build military and economic strength. Today, diversity in the United States means something more. Immigrant communities flourish not only in large cities but also in smaller towns and rural areas. A mosaic has replaced the melting pot, and, more than ever, immigrants connect their new communities to their countries of origin. Along the southern border of the United States, for instance, immigration experts talk about "transnational communities," about clusters of families in the United States linked with the villages of Mexico and Central America. Now, where you are from means where you can, and do, go back to -- and whom you know and trust enough to network with.

Consider, for example, how valuable the overseas Chinese community has been to China. Alan Wang, a former student of mine, was born in China, moved to Australia with his family at the age of 12, and went to college and

law school there. He later came to the United States to pursue a graduate degree at Harvard. For a while, he practiced law with a large British firm in London, and then moved to its Shanghai office. When I asked him how he identified himself, he replied, "overseas Chinese." Millions of people similar to Wang have spread out from China throughout Southeast Asia, Australia, the United States, and Canada, creating trading and networking opportunities for people in all those places. Similarly, the United States must learn to think of its ethnic communities as the source of future generations of "overseas Americans." Already, young Chinese Americans and Indian Americans are heading back to their parents' homelands to seek opportunity and make their fortunes. Soon, the children of U.S. immigrants from Africa, Asia, Latin America, and the Middle East will follow a similar path and return to their ethnic homelands, at least for a time. The key to succeeding in a networked economy is being able to harvest the best ideas and innovations from the widest array of sources. In this regard, the United States is plugged into all corners of the global brain.

Beyond its immigrant communities, the United States can also depend on a new generation to forge connections around the world. John Zogby, the influential pollster, calls Americans between the ages of 18 and 29 "the First Globals," a group he describes as "more networked and globally engaged than members of any similar age cohort in American history." More than half of the respondents aged 18 to 29 in a poll conducted in the United States in June 2007 by Zogby International said that they had friends or family living outside the United States, vastly more than any other U.S. age group. Other Zogby polls have shown that this generation holds passports in roughly the same proportion as other age groups but uses them far more frequently. A quarter of this group, according to Zogby's data, believes that they will "end up living for some significant period in a country other than America."

These young people spreading out around the world will be a huge asset to the United States. Children born abroad who acquire U.S. citizenship as a result of their parents' heritage or life decisions will add to this number. A college classmate of mine was born to Hungarian immigrants in Canada and later acquired U.S. citizenship. After graduation, he moved to China and then Japan, where he gained a Japanese residency permit while also applying for Hungarian citizenship. He now lives with his Chinese wife in Beijing, where his daughter was born. Not long after her birth, he took her to Tokyo so that she could register as a U.S. citizen and reenter China on a U.S. passport. These stories are legion in any large global city -- couples from two different countries who are raising their children in a third or fourth or even fifth country. For many people who orbit in this floating cloud of nationalities, a U.S. passport, particularly now that the United States has relaxed its rules on dual citizenship, has become a new kind of reserve currency. With one, even the most venturesome and peripatetic have the guarantee of the political and cultural stability of the West. The United States must devise the incentives and conditions that will allow it to both encourage this phenomenon and profit from it.

THE WORLD IS ROUND AGAIN

For most of modern history, the Eurocentric view of the world has placed North and South America in a hemisphere of their own -- the Western Hemisphere. Today, the world is mapped in the round, with Asia in the East and Africa, the Americas, and Europe in the West. That, at least, is how some Asians increasingly think of themselves. In his recently published book, *The New Asian Hemisphere: The Irresistible Shift of Global Power to the East*, Mahbubani argues that the era of "Western domination of world history is over" and that the world is witnessing an "Asian march to modernity."

But if half of the world is now "the East," defined as the Asian hemisphere, then the other half is the Atlantic hemisphere, made up of Africa, the Americas, and Europe. It is quite a promising neighborhood, home to a wealth of human, economic, material, and natural resources. Politically, Europe and North America constitute a spreading community of liberal democracies that accounts for one-sixth of the world's population, almost 60 percent of global GDP, and the two primary global reserve currencies. More trade and direct investment pass over the Atlantic Ocean than any other part of the world -- over \$2 trillion in cumulative foreign direct investment alone. The potential for further integration of the hemisphere is enormous.

Even more important is the potential for deeper economic integration within the Americas. On energy questions, Canadian oil sands and Brazilian sugar cane are more promising than depending on Russian pipelines or Sudanese oil. Markets for renewable energy -- such as from biomass, wind, geothermal technology, and other sources -- are growing in Latin America. Miami is already a financial center for Latin America, and the steady growth of the Latino population in the United States will only deepen intra-American investment. The rise of Brazil and, to a somewhat lesser extent, Mexico will create an emerging counterbalance to the United States south of its border. But any initiative for strengthening economic ties must come from the United States itself. It first must address its immigration policy and then, similar to the economic and political assistance it provided

An event in the life of a nation sometimes has deeper significance than what appears on the surface. The accord by which the government all but ceded administrative and judicial control to militants and their Taliban affiliates in Swat is such a development. This has profound implications for the country that have been obscured by the facile discussions on many TV talk shows. It may well mark a turning point in the country's struggle with rising militancy.

The Swat deal signifies several things all at once. First and foremost it represents a retreat for Jinnah's Pakistan. Whatever the apologists of the deal may claim, it is the very antithesis of the vision and ideals inspired by the country's founder, the core of which was a modern, unified Muslim state, not one fragmented along obscurantist and sectarian lines. Several times during and after the struggle for freedom, the Quaid-e-Azam emphatically ruled out anything resembling a throwback to obscurantism or any variant of theocracy. His leadership rested on principle and according to one of his biographers, he preferred "political wilderness to playing to the gallery".

Today the country's erstwhile leaders do not lead but are led by their dubious interpretation of what the "people want" in Swat, an act of monumental self-deception as any climate of 'opinion' created at gunpoint represents coercion, not consent. Rattled by more aggressive actions by militants, the political and security establishments caved in to the challenge rather than confront it. The Swat deal signalled weakness and bankruptcy on the part of the ruling elite that chose appeasement as the pathway to address the country's mounting internal security challenges. While the government showed no leadership or capacity to govern, the country's security institutions failed to protect its citizens, and legislators (save for the MQM) preferred expediency to principle. Can any of these actors claim to have upheld Jinnah's ideals or legacy?

The agreement forged between the ANP government and Sufi Mohammed, head of the outlawed Tehreek-e-Nifaz-e-Shariat-e-Mohammadi (TNSM), on February 16

was effected through a presidential edict on April 13, and endorsed by a hastily contrived parliamentary resolution. This followed months of policy chaos, on again, off again peace accords and stop-go military operations, accompanied by rising violence and the virtual collapse of any civil administration in Swat. Indeed this backdrop of rudderless, directionless rule at the centre reinforced the state of national disarray and created the conditions for the eventual Swat surrender.

Amidst this policy confusion, political leaders seemed bereft of any vision or the courage needed to steer the country in a clear direction, and preferred instead to strike a Faustian bargain with little regard for the consequences. Just as government figures were portraying the latest financial bailout from the international community as a triumph of its hat-in-hand diplomacy, Islamabad was conceding ground to militants in Swat.

A combination of factors, including political short-sightedness and expediency, pursuit of narrow agendas and fear of reprisals by militants, has resulted in choosing a course in Swat that will have serious ramifications for the country. This indicates, above all, a loss of nerve and will by the political and military leadership that seems to have convinced itself that it can contain militancy by conceding to it. But it has set the dangerous precedent of state power surrendering to a local militant force on the dubious premise of 'peace at any price'.

Advocates of the deal in and outside the government marshal a number of arguments to justify it. A major rationale adduced for the Nizam-e-Adl Regulation is that it is no different from the agreements reached in 1994 and 1999 by the Benazir Bhutto and Nawaz Sharif governments and is sanctioned by the special status enjoyed by the Provincially Administered Tribal Areas in the constitution. The verdicts of Qazi courts provided in the Adl Regulation will in any case be subject to appeal in the High and Supreme Courts and so will ultimately be consistent with the laws in the rest of the country.

Moreover, it is argued, that the regulation is in consonance with the wishes of the people of Swat who want the restoration of peace above all else. Trading a form of Sharia justice in return for peace is not being lily-livered but pragmatic. As the NWFP governor and assorted ANP leaders have declared, this regulation was "the only way to bring peace." The deal in fact aims to separate the moderates from the militant Taliban.

These claims ignore the political context in which the deal has been forged, with whom and on what terms. Invoking the parallels of 1994 and 1999 is spurious logic as 2009 represents a vastly transformed environment in which the militants entrenched in Swat are affiliated with the Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) which, officials themselves say, poses a threat to the country's security. How this agreement de-couples Sufi Mohammed's TNSM from these allies no one has cared to explain. It is the TTP militants who hold sway behind the figure of Sufi Mohammed, who was the mediator between the government and the Swat Taliban.

Nor does the argument hold up that the system instituted in Swat will be consistent with Pakistan's constitution. The fig leaf of the state's writ overseeing the Nizam-e-Adl implementation has already been ripped apart by Sufi Mohammed who announced last Sunday that the decisions of the Qazi courts will be final and not subject to appeal in the High and Supreme Courts which he denounced along with the constitution and democracy as un-Islamic. He also declared that judges to the Qazi courts will be appointed with the consent of his organisation. This has thrown into sharp relief the reality of a parallel law being established.

The argument trotted out about Swat's 'special status' overlooks the fact that modern statehood requires that laws are unified whereas the regulation fragments the system of law and justice. And as the people who will administer the new regulation are no experts in Muslim jurisprudence or even theology, this cannot even be considered a move toward Islamisation. It is little more than surrender to a medieval form of obscurantism practised by the Taliban.

As for the rather rich claim that the regulation has been promulgated in deference to the popular will in Swat, this confuses coercion with consent. If the men of violence are able to create a climate of fear and intimidation and the army too fails to come to the people's rescue, local inhabitants will obviously want a cessation of violence. But this is fundamentally different from people becoming instant converts to the worldview espoused by the TNSM and the Taliban.

Few will take issue with a peace agreement if it is forged with those prepared to renounce violence and predicated on an explicit acceptance of the writ of the state. The Swat deal doesn't meet this criterion. Negotiated in haste and under duress, the agreement has not been accompanied by any explanation as to the obligations agreed to by the TNSM, much less about how these will be enforced. Even an undertaking of decommissioning weapons is shrouded in mystery, contrary to official claims that the TNSM will ask its Taliban allies to surrender their arms.

The Swat deal marks a dangerous precedent for several reasons. One, it sets up a parallel justice system that has been 'won' in the shadow of the gun. One-third of NWFP, which the Malakand division represents, has been placed under this parallel law. Two, it cedes space to the militants who wreaked violence, killed at will, burnt girls' schools and spread mayhem that led to the exodus of tens of thousands of people from the valley. Virtually handing over Swat in this backdrop is tantamount to the state acceding to a form of Taliban warlordism. Far from halting creeping Talibanisation, Islamabad's concession has unintentionally conferred legitimacy to their agenda.

Three, it serves to embolden militant forces to advance further and beyond Swat. Already Sufi Mohammed has vowed to spread the system he calls the 'sharia' to the surrounding region and the rest of the country. The demonstration effect is also evident in the call given by the recently released cleric of Lal Masjid, Maulana Abdul Aziz, for the Swat success to be replicated in all of Pakistan. What is to stop a small band of militants from seizing territory, coercing the inhabitants and holding them to ransom until their cries for peace are responded to by Islamabad with another dose of 'pragmatism' and deference to public wishes? And four, the Swat experiment risks stoking sectarian tensions which will have further deleterious effects on the social fabric and the body politic.

Finally it is worth recounting what an Afghan friend once told me as she recalled her country's experience: "They don't have to seize the capital to take over the country." The sense of distance and complacency that is bred by the atmosphere of power and privilege in Islamabad should not blind the government to the looming threat of militancy which its own missteps have heightened.





Current Initiatives in Liberia**

CHF International is managing an innovative combination of initiatives in Liberia aimed at: (1) Providing financing to help small and medium enterprises (SMEs) grow, and, (2) Building the capacity of entrepreneurs to help them grow their businesses and obtain financing from commercial sources. The two initiatives are described below.

Liberian Enterprise Development Finance Company (LEDFC)

LEDFC was established in 2007 as a result of commitments made at the Clinton Global Initiative. LEDFC is a Liberian-registered non-bank financial institution that provides financing to enable Liberian small and medium enterprises (SMEs) to start up, upgrade, and expand. The Overseas Private Investment Corporation (OPIC) has committed \$20 million in loan capital while the Robert L. Johnson (RLJ) Foundation provided \$3 million to fund operating costs and a business development services program. CHF International owns and manages LEDFC.

After facing several months of start-up and operating challenges, LEDFC embarked on a turnaround program and is now poised for significant growth. So far, LEDFC has approved 16 loans for an aggregate amount of \$2.2 million, and has a healthy pipeline of loans under review. The types of businesses financed by LEDFC include hospitality, transportation, construction materials, retailing, agribusiness, and food services. LEDFC has an additional eight loan proposals in the pipeline.

With \$17.8 million of loan capital remaining to deploy, LEDFC presents a significant opportunity for the development of the Liberia private sector and the creation of new jobs. However, LEDFC will need additional operating funding so that it can continue to operate past the Spring of 2010.

The business environment in Liberia is rich in potential but highly constrained by the lack of capacity among local businesses. Financing needs are great, but bankable businesses are scarce and loan underwriting is labor intensive. Most businesses are unable to prepare proper business plans, accurately determine their financing needs, or provide reliable financial statements. Much needs to be done in the area of business training and the development of business development services.

Certificate Program for Women Entrepreneurs (CPWE)

To improve the capacity of local businesses – women entrepreneurs in particular -- Goldman Sachs provided a grant to CHF International to launch the 10,000 Women Certificate Program for Women Entrepreneurs (CPWE) program in Liberia. The aim of CPWE is to stimulate the supply and an effective demand market for practical business training in Liberia. As a part of the wider Goldman Sachs 10,000 Women Initiative, CPWE has several expected outcomes including the development of local business training capacity, improving underserved women's access to business education, and strengthening local business institutions. In the short-term, CPWE plans to provide business training to 60 women entrepreneurs to improve their skill sets and help them increase their chances of securing access to credit. Over the long term, CPWE is building the capacity of Liberian higher







Ans: I don't know – WJC likely discussed his views – WJC has been quite tough on this issue and pursuit of nuc weapons but don't yet have a full readout from team to know so I would be speculating b/y that; I can tell you they discussed the positive things that would flow from a better relationship and pressed the abductees/detainees

Garret, Fox: in this sequence of events, did WJC speak with Bo (or did Gore speak with BO); what about HRC's spat about the NK's behavior which was curious – can you address both?

Ans: Gore has been directly vigorously involved in trying to get his colleagues release, tireless in his efforts including with USG and at least one conversation with BO; President Bo has not spoke to WJC about this mission; WJC has spoken with NSC in determining the bonafides of offer and that it would succeed and prior to trip he was briefed on 2 occasions (last one last sat at his residence in wash) as we do with other Americans on issues and circumstances in Korea ;

Garrett: and on the spat: hrc/school girl; NK/spoiled child – odd given diplomacy was going on



On June 9, Shangri-la Entertainment applied for a license from OFAC (Office of Foreign Assets Control, U.S. Department of the Treasury) under 31 CFR § 515.564(b), for a group of film professionals to travel to Havana, Cuba to conduct professional research for a docu-drama film (currently titled "Miramar"), that the company is preparing to make.
2. Stephen Rivers, representing Shangri-la, has been communicating with OFAC for several weeks regarding this license application, by phone and fax. (He also tried a number of times, via phone and fax, to reach Bisa Williams, director of the Office of Cuban Affairs at the State Department, but never heard back from her or anyone else in her office.)
3. Today (Thursday, June 16), [redacted] of OFAC informed Stephen Rivers in a phone conversation that the State Department had reviewed the license application and advised OFAC that the application was inconsistent with the Administration's policy towards Cuba. She said OFAC would be willing the license only one person to go to Cuba to conduct the research.
4. Stephen Rivers replied, on the phone call and in a follow-up fax, that this decision is inconsistent with the previous licensing practice by OFAC on licenses issued to him on another film project, which licenses allowed several persons, not just one, to travel to Cuba to conduct the research. He explained that this one vs. several issue had been previously discussed and decided by OFAC in favor of licensing several people to travel under a license for professional film research. (He further explained, as he had in a phone call with [redacted] on Tuesday, that filmmaking is a collaborative process that requires the participation of many people, and sending only one person to conduct the research is wholly insufficient.)
5. Shangri-la is requesting that OFAC and State simply follow their previous precedent under very similar (if not identical) circumstances and issue the applied for license by mid-day on Friday, June 17. (That is the deadline for reserving the flight to Havana, which is scheduled for June 29; we need to have the license in hand to reserve the plane, and if we cannot reserve the plane by the end of the afternoon tomorrow it will be impossible to do so.)
6. If the concern of OFAC and State is the number of people who would travel under the license (13 were listed in the application), then we would be willing to reduce the number of travelers to a mutually agreed-upon number that would fulfill the professional research purposes of the trip while reassuring OFAC and State that only those who absolutely needed to travel will do so.

SUBJECT: Summary of Initiatives in Africa

In preparation for the Secretary's upcoming trip to Africa, please find the attached summary of various initiatives for your review. The list of initiatives provides an overview of existing and new collaborative efforts being forged by the public, private, and civil sectors throughout Africa and focused on the following six countries: Angola, Democratic Republic of Congo, Kenya, Liberia, Nigeria, and South Africa.

This summary is compiled from the information found in our Clearinghouse database, gathered from a variety of private sector organizations of which our office has close ties, and collected during recent meetings. For example, we recently met with the United Nations (UN) to discuss a proposal for the establishment of a Regional Centre for Partnerships in Africa – a joint initiative of the African Union, the UN Office for Partnerships to promote multi-stakeholder partnerships and serve as a Centre of Excellence for training within the Region – which could be an important initiative to support.

In looking at the various initiatives, a few key themes are apparent:

- The private sector is engaged in many initiatives supporting economic growth, mainly focused on providing access to finance, entry into new markets, and business training for the economically disadvantaged.
- The wide array of organizations active and the richness of activities throughout Africa demonstrate a need to convene a large group of people when visiting each country.

- Health is a major issue affecting many communities in Africa and various private sector initiatives are helping to address basic living standards, such as access to clean water and sanitation, along with fighting the devastating effects of diseases, such as HIV/AIDS.

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African Diaspora Marketplace: In recognition of the important but largely untapped potential that diaspora communities can play in the economic growth and development of their countries of origin, **USAID** and **Western Union (WU)** have partnered to launch the African Diaspora Marketplace (ADM), a \$1.4 million business competition open to U.S.-based African diaspora members. Between 10 – 20 winners will receive up to \$100,000 in matching grants to further their business proposals for sustainable, commercially-oriented start-up and established businesses that will boost economic opportunities and employment in sub-Saharan Africa. To date, the competition, which was launched on June 2, has already received nearly 400 applications and lots of press both in the US and in Africa. In addition to providing grants, USAID will also provide credit and/or technical assistance opportunities through existing programs in Africa. The competition closes on July 30, 2009.

Frontier 100: The **Initiative for Global Development (IGD)**, an alliance of business leaders that champions effective solutions to global poverty, is launching Frontier 100 in collaboration with **Dalberg Global Development Advisors**, a strategic consulting firm advising senior management on the challenges of business and development. Launched in May 2009, Frontier 100 is a network of the most successful CEOs operating in frontier markets with leading CEOs from the United States and Europe. The program has two primary components: first, it is a forum for relationship building and knowledge sharing about effective business models in poverty reduction among other issues; second, it is a vehicle for the CEOs to pursue targeted initiatives in areas such as access to finance, workforce development, entry into markets, and advocacy to improve investor perceptions.

Moving The World: In December 2002, **TNT** and the **United Nations World Food Programme (WFP)** launched a ground-breaking, multi-million dollar partnership to help fight global hunger. **TNT** is committed to sharing its highly qualified staff, skills and resources in transportation and logistics to generate cash and in-kind donations. The partnership with **TNT** focuses on the following 5 initiatives consisting of subprojects on which a joint **TNT-WFP** team works closely in planning, development and planning: emergency response, joint logistics supply chain, private sector fundraising, school feeding support, and transparency & accountability.

Books for Africa: This NGO that collects donated text, library and reference books and ships them to Africa has partnered with the **UN High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR)** to provide books to refugee camps on the continent. Under a pilot project, 25,000 books were shipped to Dukwe refugee camp in Botswana. Books for Africa is now seeking to arrange a shipment of 400,000 books to camps in Kenya, Rwanda, Tanzania and Uganda.

The Global Polio Eradication Initiative: This initiative has become the largest public health initiative the world has ever known, utilizing the skills and talents of **WHO**, **UNICEF**, the **US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)**, **USAID**, **Rotary International**, the **UN Foundation (UNF)** and hundreds of other NGOs. The Initiative has worked closely with more than 200 national governments, UN agencies, local NGOs, traditional and religious leaders, multilateral organizations, donor governments and foundations, vaccine manufacturers, and 20 million volunteers to ensure that every child under age five years of age is vaccinated. Roughly two billion children around the world have been immunized against polio, backed by an international investment of over \$4 billion. Innovative partnership efforts have included a financing mechanism whereby **UNF**, the **Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation**, **Rotary International** and **CDC** will "buy down" the IDA loans from the **World Bank** provided to Pakistan, Nigeria and Afghanistan to procure oral polio vaccine, and effectively turn the loans to grants, as well as

successful outreach to new partners such as the **African Union**, the **G8**, the **European Union**, the **Organization of the Islamic Conference**, the **Organisation Internationale de la Francophonie**, and the **Commonwealth**.

Roll Back Malaria Initiative: Launched in 1998 by **WHO**, **UNICEF**, **UNDP**, and the **World Bank** to halve the world's malaria burden by 2010, this initiative is growing rapidly, bringing together the private sector, foundations, academic institutions, civil society and governments. The program's prevention efforts include providing bed nets, researching new medicines, monitoring disease incidence, treating disease, and strengthening health services. Major private sector partners include **Sumitomo Chemical** and **ExxonMobil**. **Sumitomo Chemical** has developed a mosquito bed netting with Insecticide embedded directly into the fibers of the net material and has provided the technology at no cost to a local netting manufacturer in Tanzania, to establish a base for mass production. **ExxonMobil** provides essential education and training programs to needed areas and supports RBM efforts in Angola, Cameroon, Chad, Equatorial Guinea and Nigeria.

Coca-Cola Tackling AIDS in Africa: In June 2001, the joint **United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS)** announced a partnership with the **Coca-Cola Africa Foundation** to help coordinate local support for AIDS programs in Africa through the **Coca-Cola** system and local bottling partners. **Coca-Cola** provides logistical support to HIV/AIDS activities managed by other actors and contributes to activities already identified as national priorities. **Coca-Cola Africa Foundation** provides marketing expertise to develop public awareness and information campaigns for **UNAIDS** and other partners across Africa.

Sustainable ICT Solutions for SMEs: The **United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO)** and **Microsoft** joined forces in a strategic partnership to tackle the root causes of poverty by promoting innovative uses of Information and Communication Technologies (ICTs) that support entrepreneurship, help promote investment and create business opportunities, especially for SMEs in Africa. Areas of focus for the partnership are concentrating on improving IT skills and awareness through localized **UNIDO** portals, delivery of online SME business services and training tools, facilitating exchange of information online and developing local software applications. The partnership recognizes the importance of harnessing the use of ICT for promoting sustainable industrialization throughout the developing world as a means of improving livelihoods in developing countries.

Cisco Networking Academy Initiative in the Least Developed Countries (LDCs): **Cisco Systems, Inc.** and **UNDP** jointly launched the Least Developed Countries (LDCs) Initiative at the G-8 Summit in July 2000. The goal of the initiative is to help train students for jobs in the Internet economy. Since the announcement of the partnership, **Cisco Systems**, **UNDP**, the **United Nations Volunteer program (UNV)**, and **USAID** have been working together to train students (and trainers) for the internet economy by establishing the Cisco Networking Academy Program in economic institutions. The partners established 200 academies in 40 LDCs with over 10,000 students enrolled and an outstanding achievement of 30% female participation, a total of 2,901 female graduates. The Networking Academy Program provides students with skills that enable them to design build and maintain computer networks.

ANGOLA

Agricultural Development and Finance Program: Chevron and the Cooperative League of America are partners in this \$8.4M initiative, which will carry through September 2011. This program improves food security by giving farmers and agribusiness access to finance and related services, and by increasing the sector's reach from production through processing and marketing of bananas, coffee and potatoes. Partners deliver technical assistance to increase agricultural yields and improve productivity; provide technical assistance to improve processing practices; expand producers' access to market information systems; train producers on how to identify market opportunities, enter contracts and form business alliances; and foster productive and sustainable relationships between commercial banks and agricultural enterprises, including farmer organizations.

Angola Pro-Agro: In the wake of a 27-year civil war, USAID partnered with Chevron and World Vision to meet the subsistence needs of 210,000 vulnerable and food insecure households in five of the Planalto provinces of Angola. The Consortium for Development Relief in Angola encouraged sustainable food production and labor practices. Since launching in 2002, the partnership has helped hundreds of thousands of Angolans rebuild their lives by supporting activities to restore agricultural capacity (i.e. increase yields and link up profitably to markets created by oil industry operations) in the war-torn Planalto region of the country. This partnership also focuses on strengthening agricultural institutions, such as facilitating the start-up of Novo Banco, which in its first two years of operation, extended a remarkable \$20 million in loans to Angola's underserved micro and small entrepreneurs.

Rural Development Institute (RDI): RDI is a nonprofit organization of attorneys helping the rural poor in developing countries obtain legal rights to land. RDI attorneys are experts in land law and policy who work with governments of developing countries, foreign aid agencies, and other partners to reform land law and consult on land policy. RDI is working through Rede Terra in Angola to ensure that the land rights formalization process incorporates gender-sensitive procedures, that women participate in that process, and that their land rights are formally recognized. RDI recently released a report as part of the USAID funded project Strengthening Land Tenure and Property Rights in Angola that explores both the formal and customary laws that affect women's property rights. The report examines women's property rights in cases of widowhood, divorce, polygamy and girls' inheritance rights and provides recommendations for strengthening women's rights to land.

Junior Achievement (JA) Angola: JA Worldwide is the world's largest organization dedicated to educating students about workforce readiness, entrepreneurship and financial literacy through experiential, hands-on programs. As part of the \$1.655M initiative in which USAID partners with Alcatel-Lucent, Chevron, Coca Cola, and ExxonMobil (Esso Angola), JA in Angola has introduced three programs to Angolan youth: the *Company Program*, upper grade students organize, operate and liquidate an actual business enterprise with the support and guidance of their teachers and volunteer consultants from the local business community; the *Personal Economics Program*, middle grade students explore career options, and learn fundamental skills about managing money, budgeting, and the pros or cons of using and abusing credit; and the *Job Shadow Program* introduces students to future, possible careers through one-day, on-site orientation or through more extensive internships. Local businesses participate by supporting program operations through cash contributions, making staff available to teach and mentor young people; serving on the board of directors and sponsoring events.

Private Sector Alliance Against HIV-AIDS: Conceived by the **National Institute of Fight Against HIV/AIDS (INLS)**, in a partnership with **USAID** and **Odebrecht**, this alliance provides opportunities for companies to develop HIV/AIDS programs and exchange experiences in HIV/AIDS prevention. The alliance is channeling private sector resources, energy and capabilities to reinforce Angolan efforts to deliver AIDS prevention and behavior change messages to employees, their families and communities; providing a forum for companies to share their HIV/AIDS related experiences and materials; and improving communication and feedback between the private sector and the **INLS**. **USAID** has been able to leverage in-kind support from the alliance's private sector partners to store and distribute **USAID's** 15 million condoms throughout the country to communities for free.

Winrock International: **Winrock's** "Angola Women in Extension and Education Project" is training women leaders to provide agriculture extension services to women farmers which will strengthen the capacity of women to actively participate in local and national development. By providing scholarships and training programs that women need to succeed and to enter new fields, **Winrock** emphasizes working in partnership with community leaders and male leaders to understand local development through a gender framework. The following outcomes are expected of program activities: expanded maize production in tons/ha among female farmers (Angola, Namibia); higher protein intakes of households, especially of children, in rural areas (Angola, Namibia, South Africa); expanded consumption of wheat flour products in Angola; greater capacity of agricultural industries to supply the needs of farmers and consumers in all three countries; local markets opened for U.S.-produced wheat flour; greater implementation of gender-sensitive agricultural projects at the provincial level in the Republic of South Africa; decreased time required to perform basic household chores, such as hauling water or firewood.

The Chevron Foundation: **Chevron** launched the Angola Partnership Initiative in 2002 with the goals to promote peace and stability and improve health and education. It also seeks to help build the capacity of Angolan nongovernmental organizations and government development agencies and to help reduce poverty through agribusiness and the development of micro, small and medium-size enterprises. **Chevron's** initial \$25 million investment was matched by \$31 million from partnerships from national and multilateral development organizations. They have invested in community and economic development projects in 15 of Angola's 18 provinces. In 2008, they joined partners in committing more than \$10 million dollars in aid.

Search for Common Ground (SFCG) - Angola: **SFCG** established an office in Angola in 1996 to support the peace and reconciliation process in the post-Lusaka phase. During eleven years of its operation, **SFCG-Angola** has carried out activities with media, civil society, community members and the Angolan government that include civil society empowerment, peaceful elections education, and reintegration of former combatants. With offices in Luanda and Cabinda, a full-time radio production studio, and a community outreach toolbox that includes conflict resolution training, community organizing, facilitation, and youth empowerment, **SFCG** seeks to transform Angolan society into a culture of coexistence, security, social justice and popular participation. An innovative music project, "Angola Solta a Tua Voz" (Angola Lift Up Your Voice), involved the production of a new CD in Angola that features the most popular musicians from across Angola. Each song is a duet between musicians who normally would not perform together – merging generations and blending different styles of music from around the country – symbolically marking the beginning of a new era in Angola characterized by inclusion, participation, and unity.

Strengthening Women's Contribution to Conflict Prevention and Resolution: The aim of this project, led by UNIFEM and supported by the UN Foundation, is to protect and assist women affected by conflict and to support their role in conflict prevention, resolution and post-conflict peace-building in Colombia, Somalia, Angola, Melanesia and Sierra Leone. The three focus areas are the development of gender sensitive tools for early warning and conflict prevention; strengthening humanitarian protection and assistance for women affected by conflict; and supporting the capacity-building of women and their participation in peace negotiations.

Prospective Partnerships

Proposed US-Angola Dialogue: Foreign Minister Dos Anjos has designated Angolan Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MIREX) Vice Minister Exalgisa Gamboa as the lead for the Angolan side of a proposed US-Angola high-level dialogue. The Foreign Minister broached the idea with Secretary Clinton in their meeting in May, the subject of further discussion in June between A/S Carson and the Angolan Ambassador. Most recently, MIREX Americas Desk Deputy Director met with the DCM in Luanda to offer additional detail on the proposal. Post strongly supports development of the mechanism. MIREX has suggested that the high-level dialogue could be a useful tool for fast-tracking military-to-military cooperation, creating a PEPFAR framework, and establishing a Peace Corps presence.

English language training: Many Angolan government officials have informed the Ambassador that English language training is a priority need for Angola's economic and social development. Post has signaled that 75-100 Peace Corps volunteers teaching English at secondary schools in Angola's provincial capitals and other major cities could help address this pressing need.

Ex-Im 101 Seminar: On June 17, Post, in conjunction with the U.S. Angola Chamber of Commerce, organized a half-day "Ex-Im 101" seminar for Angolan businesses wishing to access ExIm's new \$120M credit facility. More than 200 businesses and Angolan government officials attended the event, led by a joint delegation of ExIm and OPIC officials, who visited the country at that time. Entrepreneurs represented all sectors with concentrated interest in agriculture and construction. The US officials' visit and the seminar received heavy print, radio and television coverage.

DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF CONGO

Collaboration for HIV/AIDS Prevention and Treatment in Matadi: USAID's GDA, Family Health International and Seaboard Corporation along with its local non-governmental organization CCLD, partnered to develop a comprehensive HIV/AIDS prevention and treatment program in Matadi, a sea port town in the DRC. The partnership dedicated just under \$1M in resources to the CCLD by supplying rapid tests and other equipment, initiating procurement of lab equipment and pharmaceuticals, and training 16 staff members in syndromic management. The partnership concluded its work in September 2008.

Extractive Industries Alliance: This alliance among USAID, Anvil Mining, TFK, First Quantum Minerals and Angol Gold Ashanti promotes sustainable and equitable economic recovery and improved governance in Katanga and the DRC, through: (1) establishing a regional development fund to efficiently and effectively channel social development needs of local populations, with the ultimate goal of self-sustainability; (2) implementing sustainable and participatory community development projects based on identified needs of the community, linked with improved governance at local, territorial and provincial levels; (3) supporting improved governance, tax and royalty transparency and society responsible investment in the mining sector in the DRC. Partners have built six classrooms; trained 350 men and women in conflict resolution; reached more than 1,000 people from at-risk groups through conflict mitigation activities; strengthened more than 50 non-governmental constituency groups engaging sub-national governments, all of which has directly benefited 1,275 rural households. Resources dedicated to the effort total \$25M.

National HIV/AIDS Hotline: In partnership with major cell phone companies VODACOM, ZAIN and TIGO, the Kinshasa School of Public Health has increased information available on HIV transmission and the consequences of AIDS. The companies will provide hardware, free cell phone access and small scale publicity for a proposed 24/7 service, and make available at least ten phone lines for the HIV/AIDS national information hotline. They also will provide mechanical recording of all incoming calls to identify usage, peak hours, unanswered phone calls, location of caller and other valuable information that will be used for monitoring and evaluation of quality of response and care. The companies have committed to a nationwide publicity campaign for the hotline to increase access to the service, which will be phased in to avoid creating a larger demand than the system is able to handle. The partnership will operate with total resources of \$1.7M.

Central Africa Regional Program for the Environment (CARPE): CARPE is a long term initiative by USAID supporting the activities of the Congo Basin Forest Partnership which consists of 41 members including governments, intergovernmental organizations, international environmental associates, and businesses. The partnership supports a network of national parks, protected areas, and forestry concessions, and assists communities that depend upon the conservation of forest and wildlife resources. The partnership has advocated for improved environmental policies, and was responsible for creating a clause in the Congolese forestry code that allows communities to create "community forests," with rights to collectively manage land and associated wildlife and forests, so as to provide incentives for the community to invest in forestry preservation. As a result of these and other projects currently underway as part of the CARPE program, 45,000,000 hectares of terrestrial and marine habitats of biological significance are under improved management reducing the rate of biodiversity loss.

Dikembe Mutombo Foundation: This Foundation is dedicated to improving the health, education and quality of life for the people of the DRC and strives to accomplish this goal through an emphasis on primary health care and disease prevention, the promotion of health policy, health research and increased access to health care education for the people of the Congo. One of the foundation's major projects is the Biamba Marie Mutombo Hospital and Research Center in Kinshasa opened in July 2007.

Women for Women International: This organization mobilizes women to change their lives through a holistic approach that addresses the unique needs of women in conflict and post-conflict environments. Through its work in the DRC, the majority of women affected report that their personal and family health improved, their economic situation advanced, confidence in their abilities increased, knowledge of their rights deepened, and they became more active in their community and in family decision making.

Tenke Fungurume Mining (TFM): TFM is a DRC-based mining concession project of Canadian firm **Lundin Mining Corporation**, which acquired **Tenke Mining Corp** in 2007. On May 7, the U.S. Ambassador visited **TFM's** site 100 miles northwest of Lubumbashi in Katanga province. **TFM** has invested approximately \$1.75B in the first phase of its development to bring copper and cobalt production online. **TFM** is funding several social responsibility programs, which target the local community of approximately 61,000 inhabitants. **TFM** reported expenditures of \$9M for community development (schools, clinics, clean water wells, markets) and \$2M for malaria control programs, and \$12M to resettle 350 households in three villages too close to mining operations. **TFM** is also working with **PACT Congo**, an NGO, to provide microcredit to small business entrepreneurs engaged in brick and fence construction and other activities.

KENYA

Partnership for an HIV Free Generation: In a partnership coordinated by PEPFAR, leaders from the private sector have joined forces with the public sector and non-governmental organizations to revolutionize HIV prevention for youth by engaging the partners' core competencies to help drive down rates of HIV infection among youth by 50% over the next five years. The partnership brings together an unprecedented coalition to address HIV prevention for youth, including *Accenture Development Partners, The Africa Broadcast Media Partnership Against HIV/AIDS, APCO Worldwide, The Coca-Cola Africa Foundation, The Draper Richards Foundation, Girl Scouts of the USA/Girl Guides of Kenya, Grassroot Soccer, The Global Business Coalition on HIV/AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria, Hasbro, Intel, Junior Achievement, AmericaShare/Micato Safaris, Microsoft, Mitchell Silberberg & Knupp LLP, The MTV Staying Alive Foundation, Nike Foundation, Rotarians for Fighting AIDS, TechnoServe, and Warner Bros.* Initially in Kenya, this alliance combines PEPFAR's technical and programmatic capacity with the expertise of the private sector in messaging, branding, new technologies, and real-time market research to promote and maintain behavior change. A key piece of HIV Free, "Pamoja Mtaani" ("Together in the Hood"), is an open world, multi-player PC video game created by Warner Bros. Interactive Entertainment in collaboration with technical experts within PEPFAR. The game can be played at select youth venues in Nairobi, which are an integral component of this new initiative to revolutionize HIV prevention. The game engages youth through its fun interaction while helping to influence HIV risk perceptions, attitudes and behaviors among young.

Mbita Ice Plant: This initiative seeks to increase rural household incomes by strengthening the value chain and expanding capacity of small scale fisher folk to participate more effectively in the fish market. The partners, including *Mbita Ice Plant Limited, Osienala, and W.E. Tilley*, promote production and distribution of ice to the fisher folk along Lake Victoria in the Suba District; increase access to and utilization of ice input for preserving the quality of fish and reducing the rate of fish rejection; and increasing the fisher folks' bargaining power to obtain better market prices for their catch. The fishing project will reach 384,000 people, including 65,000 at the production level (primarily men) and 319,000 in the distribution and retail level (primarily women). The Mbita ice project is estimated to increase real wages of fisher-folk by 20%-30%.

International Small Group Tree Planting Program: *The Clean Air Action Corporation, Dow Chemical Company Foundation, and Institute for Environmental Innovation* have joined efforts and resources exceeding \$3.5 million to empower small groups of subsistence farmers in combating the devastating effects of deforestation, drought, disease and famine. Small Groups accomplish their stated goals by planting trees, adopting new approaches to identified problems, and implementing sustainable agriculture methods. The initiative is providing immediate benefits through the promotion of sustainable development approaches; over the longer-term, the initiative may generate revenue for the Small Groups through the sale of Greenhouse Gas credits.

Child and Family Wellness Shops: USAID and the *HealthStore Foundation* have partnered with *ExxonMobil, IFC, Acumen Fund, and the Oswald Family Foundation* to help Kenyan entrepreneurs open their own franchise pharmacy chains. These Child and Family Wellness (CFW) shops, which are either drug shops or medical clinics, are owned and operated by health workers trained to diagnose conditions and prescribe the appropriate medications. A centralized procurement operation drives down the costs, while maintaining the quality of pharmaceutical drugs. To date, more than 60 CFW shops provide high-quality essential drug treatments and have

provided over 1 million treatments since the inception. The alliance plans to expand beyond Kenya's borders to open an additional 225 CFW Shops.

Carolina for Kibera's Binti Pomoja: Carolina for Kibera (CFK) is an international, nongovernmental organization based in the Kibera. Is run by Kenyans and advised by American and Kenyan volunteers. CFK's primary mission is to promote youth leadership and ethnic and gender cooperation in Kibera through sports, young women's empowerment, and community development while also focusing on improving basic healthcare, sanitation, and education in Kibera. The *Binti Pomoja* (Daughters United) Center is a reproductive health and women's rights center for 11 to 18 year-old girls in Kibera. The Center has helped girls explore the issues that are prevalent in their daily lives; violence against women, rape, prostitution, HIV/AIDS, female genital mutilation, poverty, sexual abuse, unequal access to education, lack of reproductive health care and information, and demanding domestic responsibilities by using photography, drama, writing, and group discussion to investigate such issues in depth. A new group of girls is recruited into the Center each year, and after two years they graduate take on leadership roles as alumni at the Center and start new girls groups in the community.

The Green Belt Movement (GBM): GBM Kenya was established in 1977 by Prof. Wangari Maathai with the vision to create a society of people who consciously work for continued improvement of their environment and a greener, cleaner Kenya. Tree planting has been the focal point of **GBM Kenya** by working mainly across nine districts nationwide and planting more than 40 million trees in Africa. Achieved results include soil erosion reduced in critical watersheds, thousands of acres of biodiversity-rich indigenous forest restored and protected, and hundreds of thousands of women and their families standing up for their rights and those of their communities to live healthier, more productive lives. **GBM** has expanded its programs to include indigenous tree planting, civic education, advocacy, food security, greenbelt eco-safaris, and "women and change." These projects have enabled **GBM Kenya** to succeed in promoting environmental consciousness, volunteerism, conservation of local biodiversity, self-empowerment, community development, and accountability.

Jamii Bora: Upon retirement from a career advocating for the poor and homeless in Kenya, Swedish founder Ingrid Munro created **Jamii Bora** with the conviction that "any family, however poor, miserable, and hopeless, is capable of getting themselves out of poverty." Beginning with 50 women, she developed a microfinance model and now works via various funds to support her mainly homeless (or formerly homeless) clients in skill building while also providing business development training, housing, health care, etc. A once-small savings matching program has grown into a nationwide microfinance institution with ambitious growth and impact plans. Their holistic approach to poverty alleviation includes alcohol rehabilitation, orphan outreach, and street beggar transition programs.

Alliance for a Green Revolution in Africa (AGRA): AGRA is working to break the cycles of hunger and poverty in Africa through a set of initiatives that will provide small-scale farmers with the tools and opportunities they need to boost their productivity, increase their incomes, and build better lives. In addition to working in areas to address key aspects of a functional, sustainable food production system in Africa, **AGRA** promotes opportunities to strengthen mixed crop-livestock systems throughout all of its areas of work.

Kickstart: Nick Moon and Martin Fisher founded **ApproTEC** (now **KickStart**) in 1991 to promote sustainable economic growth and employment by offering people technology to run profitable small-scale enterprises. Working in developing countries in Africa, mainly in Kenya, **KickStart** introduced low-cost, human-powered irrigation pumps that enable farmers to grow more crops and sell produce in the dry season. Since its inception, the organization has helped 77,000 families in Africa to create profitable businesses, generating \$85 million per year in new profits and wages. These revenues are equivalent to 0.6 percent and 0.25 percent of the Gross Domestic Product of Kenya and Tanzania, respectively.

Mothers to Mothers: While pediatric AIDS has virtually been eliminated in the developed world, in Sub-Saharan Africa, hundreds of thousands of babies are needlessly infected with HIV each year. To confront this tragedy, long-time friends Mitch Besser, a doctor and medical researcher, and Gene Falk, a media executive and AIDS activist, developed mothers2mothers. A grass-roots program for under-resourced health care systems, mothers2mothers trains and employs new mothers with HIV to provide education and support to their peers, empowering them to access lifesaving treatment for their babies and themselves. Currently operating in 462 locations in seven countries, (with 50 sites in Kenya) by 2011, mothers2mothers aims to support over 3.6 million women and children in 11 nations.

Nike Foundation & Novo Foundation: In September 2008, Maria Eitel (Nike) and Peter & Jennifer Buffet (NoVo) announced a partnership of \$45 million over three years for projects related to "the Girl Effect" - the ability of adolescent girls in developing countries to bring unprecedented social and economic change to their families, communities and countries. Liberia & Kenya are two of the project sites. In addition, the **Nike Foundation**, with the support and collaboration of the **NoVo Foundation**, has made grants to programs directed at men and boys. These investments include \$1 million to PATH in Kenya. The program is designed to test the effectiveness of merit badges for Scouts to reward them for gender equitable behavior. Men and boys are central to defining and shaping the life experiences of girls. The **Nike Foundation's** work has been building the case for international investment in girls through its a unique portfolio that funds new approaches, creates funding pipelines, nurtures models for scale and replication, makes girls a priority of institutions and proves the girl effect.

Open Society Institute: The **Open Society Initiative for East Africa (OSIEA)** promotes public participation in democratic governance, the rule of law, and respect for human rights by awarding grants, developing programs, and bringing together diverse civil society leaders and groups. **OSIEA** plays an active role in encouraging open, informed dialogue about issues of public importance in East Africa. Launched in 2005 and based in Nairobi, the **OSIEA** team supports work in Kenya, Tanzania, and Uganda as well as regional organizations whose mandate encompasses East Africa. In 2007, **OSIEA's** grant-giving budget was \$3 million, and grants focused on four key areas of activity: governance and accountability, justice and human rights, media and access to information, and regional initiatives.

Women's Institute for Secondary Education and Research (WISER): Truman Scholar Andy Cunningham founded the first all-girls secondary boarding school in Muhuru Bay, Kenya. In doing so, he completed an effort he began as a Duke University student, receiving financial and in-kind support from **Johnson & Johnson**, **Goldman Sachs**, and the **Robertson Foundation**. **WISER** also houses a research center dedicated to expanding the social and economic capital of women in the southern Lake Victoria region. **WISER** alleviates poverty by introducing new sustainable green technologies for both the school and surrounding community, including: wind

and solar energy, potable water pumped from Lake Victoria, and computer and Internet access, which enables the adolescent girls to remain at school and community members to access green collar jobs and training as part of WISER's infrastructure and maintenance programs.

LIBERIA

*Liberia has received crucial contributions from a small but growing group of philanthropic organizations and individuals who have supported Liberia's reconstruction and development since the end of the country's 14-year civil conflict in 2003. In efforts to strengthen and expand the already transformative impact of foundations in Liberia, the Government has established a Philanthropy Secretariat unit within the Office of the President to assist and coordinate the work of foundations in Liberia. It is the first country in the world to create an office of this type, funded through generous support from the **NoVo Foundation**, **Humanity United**, and the **Daphne Foundation** and launched in April 2009. An important component of the Philanthropy Secretariat's mission is to serve as a resource for those seeking to support Liberia. As part of its outreach efforts, the Government of Liberia also convenes an annual Liberia Foundations Meeting in New York city chaired by President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf.*

Humanity United (HU): HU has developed a series of ambitious initiatives to strengthen civil society and independent media. HU's flagship effort with TrustAfrica provides grants and capacity training to a cohort of leading civil society groups such as local radio stations. HU's grant-making in Liberia relies heavily on key contacts in the Liberian Government, private donor community and Liberian civil society to provide a composite picture of the accomplishments and challenges on the ground. HU focuses on areas of clear and compelling need – structural or catalytic – and directs funding toward issues (rule of law, voice and transparency) where results have been slow to materialize. The following activities have been funded in Liberia: Carter Center-Liberia Program, 1 million USD over 2 years to expand rural access to justice efforts; Liberia Law Fellows Program, 164,000 USD over 18 months to support Ministry of Justice fellows (see Scott Family Foundation entry below); Liberia Senior Executive Service (SES), 1 million USD over 3 years to recruit and train senior civil servants; Star Radio, 130,000 USD over 1 year to support the oldest independent radio station in Liberia; TrustAfrica Liberia Partnership, 2 million USD over 2 years to strengthen top Liberian civil society groups engaged in governance monitoring, community empowerment and independent media; and the Women Leaders Intercultural Forum, 250,000 USD over 18 months to organize an International Colloquium on Women's Leadership, Empowerment, International Peace and Security in Liberia.

The McCall MacBain Foundation (MMF): The MMF has chosen Liberia as its first and only developing country within Africa due to the urgency of ensuring the country's successful post-conflict recovery and MMF's confidence in the leadership of President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf. MMF has been supporting 10 programs in Liberia since June 2007 through focused one-to-five-year grants to local NGOs, international NGOs and the Government of Liberia. In total, MMF has committed approximately 10 million USD to Liberia; 5 million USD has been granted during the period between June 2007 and September 2008. Programs have focused on reducing maternal mortality, helping to secure Global Fund grants, supporting Right to Play, funding 21 buses for a city-wide bus system managed by the Monrovia Transport Authority, reducing deforestation, and building legal capacity, among other things.

The NoVo Foundation: NoVo is currently funding two projects in Liberia through the International Rescue Committee: the 15 million USD LEGACY Initiative (within four countries: Liberia, Cote D'Ivoire, Sierra Leone, and Guinea) is working to improve local educational opportunities, bolster national education policies, and focus international attention on education in fragile states; and the Women and Girls Rebuilding Nations (WGRN) project working with communities, governments, and women and girls to make sure they are able to participate in

the process of rebuilding their nations, free from discrimination and the threat of sexual and physical violence. WGRN is part of a 15 million USD, three-country initiative (Liberia, Cote D'Ivoire, and Sierra Leone). In September 2008, Maria Eitel (Nike) and Peter & Jennifer Buffet (NoVo) announced a partnership of \$45 million over three years for projects related to "the Girl Effect" - the ability of adolescent girls in developing countries to bring unprecedented social and economic change to their families, communities and countries.

The Scott Family Fellows Program: This program funds young professionals from the U.S. to serve as "special assistants" to senior Liberian government officials to address the severe capacity gap existing at the sub-ministerial level after 14 years of civil war. Fellows provide technical and administrative support to Liberian Ministers to drive the implementation of the Poverty Reduction Strategy. Initially financed through a generous contribution from philanthropist Ed Scott, 15 total Fellows are now supported by **Open Society Institute (OSI), Humanity United (HU), McCall MacBain Foundation (MMF) and the Nike Foundation.**

The Daphne Foundation: To date, the foundation (President Abigail Disney) has provided assistance to the Liberian Education Trust and the Women in Peace Security Network – Africa (WIPSEN). WIPSEN is an NGO that promotes women's strategic participation and leadership in peace and security governance in Africa. Most recently, the **Daphne Foundation** has embarked on an effort to launch alternative energy enterprises in Liberia. The Foundation has released a Request for Proposal to assess how alternative energy, including solar, can be most effectively introduced in Liberia in a way that stimulates entrepreneurial opportunities for rural women. Up to 500,000 USD in grants and/or investments will be issued in 2008. In addition, the Foundation is seeking collaborators in this initiative and will soon be convening a meeting at the Pocantico Conference Center (date TBD) of subject experts, country leaders, NGOs, donors and other stakeholders to discuss the creation and support of alternative energy sources in Liberia. Finally, Ms. Disney is also executive producer of the recent documentary *Pray the Devil Back To Hell* (best documentary at the Tribeca Film Festival in New York); a movie depicting the remarkable story of how the women of Liberia, under the leadership of Leymah Gbowee, after 16 years of war, were able to help achieve a peace accord, disarmament and expedite the democratic transition in their country.

The Nike Foundation: The **Nike Foundation** is partnering with the Government of Liberia and the **World Bank** to smooth the path of approximately 1,500 adolescent girls in Greater Monrovia and Kakata to productive employment through skills training and business development services. The training offered to participants will focus on the provision of technical skills as well as the integration of life skills to address some of the crucial barriers to the development of adolescent girls in Liberia, such as wage employment, business development skills training and links to microfinance. The partnership also works to increase the capacity of the Ministry of Gender and Development to execute the project and improve the ability of the Ministry and other stakeholders to formulate and execute policy and programming for adolescent girls. The **Nike Foundation** is also supporting two Liberia fellows (as part of the Scott Family Fellows Program), serving as special assistants to the Minister of Gender and Development and the Minister of Youth and Sports.

RLJ Companies: Robert L. Johnson, the owner of **Black Entertainment Television (BET)** in the U.S. and head of RLJ Companies, chose to invest in Liberia because he was inspired by President Johnson Sirleaf when she spoke at former President Bill Clinton's **Global Initiative (CGI)** in New York in 2007. As part of a **CGI Commitment**, **RLJ Companies** created a \$30 million Liberia Enterprise Development Fund, which is designed to make credit available to Liberian entrepreneurs working to build viable, job-creating businesses. The fund began with a \$3 million

donation from Mr. Johnson to provide the initial capital needed to open the fund, which is operated by CHF International. Short and medium-term impact will be created by direct inputs, including the provision of credit, select equity investments, and targeted technical assistance. Longer-term impact is expected to include functional commercial linkages between a significantly increased number of businesses and the Liberian financial sector, as well as the creation of a stable, commercially viable business sector. Estimates project that a \$30 million loan portfolio will meet the credit needs of more than 1,500 businesses.

Promoting Literacy in Poor Rural Areas: **Alfalit International - Liberia, Inc.** is a faith-based, non-demoninational, non-profit, grassroots organization, that provides literacy and numeracy education to Liberia's most needy citizens in communities that are the most difficult to reach. Established in 2006, **Alfalit - Liberia** has enrolled 7,177 students, most of whom are women, through a partnership with **USAID** by leveraging USG funding along with local community contributions (i.e. space for classes and volunteer teachers/facilitators) and private funding provided by **Alfalit** and its private donors for training workshops, generators, transportation, and all other program implementation costs. **Alfalit** also trains local community members to be teachers and facilitators in their own community, and works with community leaders to support and cultivate interest in its programs. Readings on malaria, tuberculosis, HIV/AIDS, first aid, nutrition, and even building solar cookers help introduce life skills and inspire students to want to read as a tool to readily improve their lives.

Investment in the Small Holder Rubber Sub-Sector: In 2007, **Firestone** and the **Rubber Planter's Association of Liberia** began working in partnership with the International Institute of Tropical Agriculture, **USAID** and the Ministry of Agriculture to create commercial opportunities that help increase smallholder incomes from rubber production and other agriculturally based activities. The program provides technical and financial assistance through the promotion of sustainable smallholder rubber production; appropriate cropping systems that increase productivity and conserve biodiversity; and long-term economics incentives. The partnership stalled due to lack of reliable data and other reasons, but was reactivated in 2009 with expanded representation and a **USAID**-funded consultant hired to draft a Rubber Sector Master Plan to be completed in October.

Locally Initiated Networks for Community Strengthening (LINCS) Program: **CHF International's** LINCS program is working to strengthen the prospects for peace and stability at the community and district levels in the northern Liberia. Program activities focus on enhancing local capacity to mitigate conflict and violence by addressing the root causes and consequences of conflicts, facilitating dispute resolution between ex-combatants and their "host" communities, and improving communication at all levels. In 2008, **Goldman Sachs** committed to work in partnership with **CHF International** to train 300 underserved Liberian women over five years in business and management in order to create a larger pool of potential loan recipients for the **Liberian Enterprise Development Company (LEDFC)**.

Open Society Initiative for West Africa: **OSIWA's** Liberia program works with governmental and non-governmental organizations to promote good governance, respect for human rights and accountability and transparency by expanding on former and current initiatives while identifying strategic interventions that will help the nation's postwar recovery efforts. **OSIWA** has supported projects and built partnerships in Liberia since the foundation's establishment in 2002, and the Liberia office was established in 2007 with priority focused on the following areas: promotion of human rights and good political and economic governance, support for information communication technologies and free media. Liberia is also one of the **OSI International Women's Program's** five

priority countries in Africa with a commitment to developing Liberian women's leadership and strengthening their participation in post-conflict reconstruction and rehabilitation. The OSI Education Support Program, together with OSIWA, the **World Bank and UNICEF**, is contributing to the renewal of the education system in Liberia through a number of projects. The West African Civil Society Institute was established by the OSIWA to enhance the capacity of civil society in the region by bridging the institutional and operational gaps identified in civil society.

The Liberia Forestry Initiative: This program is a coalition of donors, multilateral institutions and NGOs dedicated to helping the government improve forestry management and increase the transparency of its revenue collection. The U.S. Department of State launched the initiative in early 2004, with shared involvement by the U.S. Forest Service, USAID, Treasury, Conversation International and the Environmental Law Institute; a number of multilateral organizations joined the initiative in late 2004 and 2005.

West Africa Power Pool Alliance: USAID partnered with **Electricite de France International** and the international donor community supporting a \$45M investment to develop the region's electricity infrastructure, increase energy supply and enhance energy security. The project terminated 2007.

Simandou Alliance: USAID partnered with **Conversation International** and **Rio Tinto** valued at \$350,000 to help mitigate the impact of mining activities on biodiversity in the southeast of Ginea through support of local institutions and policy change. The project ended in 2007.

Prospective Partnerships

Palm oil is a tree crop with great potential; the oil can yield cooking oil, animal food and raw materials for the manufacture of cosmetics, detergents and pharmaceuticals. A number of state-owned palm oil plantations are available for rehabilitation.

Liberia's rubber sector provides 5.5% of its economic output, 85% of its exports and work for an estimated 50,000 Liberians. Roughly 40% of Liberia's rubber comes from small, Liberian-owned farms, with the remainder produced on large foreign-owned concessions. Revitalizing the rubber sector will take years and producers face challenges from theft, land disputes and access to finance. Foreign-owned concessions have been the first to invest in large-scale replanting, but many concessions are just recently reverting to private management as the government seeks to renegotiate new terms on old concession agreements. The Liberian Government amended its concession agreement with Firestone in 2008 and that now serves as a model for other current concession negotiations.

The Government of Liberia requested expressions of interest from private sector firms interested in a concession for management and operation of the Port of Monrovia. The deadline for submissions was February 26th. The management contract is the centerpiece of a broad Port Sector Reform Program that will reorganize the National Port Authority and convert the port of Monrovia into a "landlord port" model.

NIGERIA

West Africa Seed Alliance: USAID has partnered with the Alliance for a Green Revolution (AGRA) in a five-year, \$61 million initiative to develop a commercial seed industry in West Africa. The West Africa Seed Alliance seeks to develop an industry that will provide small-scale farmers in Ghana, Mali, Nigeria, Burkina Faso, and Niger with affordable, timely, and reliable access to high quality seeds and planting material. Partners expect to establish a network of more than 800 agro-dealers in five focus countries, reaching more than 500,000 farmers.

Higher Education for Development: This project seeks to improve the employability of faculty and students from selected departments at the University of Lagos Business School. Program aspects include internships, curriculum development, and collaboration with the Nigerian private sector. Partners include **Kansas State University, Microsoft, British American Tobacco, Ocean Energy Nigeria Limited, and Zinon Technologies**. The combined investment is \$2M, with \$500,000 in financial support from the private sector partners.

Casava Enterprise Development Program: In the Niger Delta, cassava production is not commercially oriented and farm management practices are poor, resulting in high production costs and low yields. **USAID, the Shell Petroleum Development Corporation, Bayelsa State Government and the International Institute of Tropical Agriculture** are working to change this with the Cassava Enterprise Development Program. This \$11.7 million, five year partnership seeks to develop and strengthen the entire cassava value chain so that farmers and entrepreneurs participate to generate greater incomes. The activity which is particularly designed to benefit women provides improved cassava varieties that resist cassava mosaic disease; develops sustainable cassava processing technologies and identify commercial markets for value-added products from cassava.

OLAM Nigeria Partnership: Nigeria is the largest net importer of rice on the African continent (roughly 3.1 million metric tons annually) and the second largest importer in the world. **USAID** and commodity trader Olam Nigeria LTD have partnered to expand the market for domestic rice consumption, a key factor in ensuring Nigeria's food security, by providing smallholder farmers with higher quality seeds, fertilizer, and formal training so that they can produce more, better rice. **Olam** supplies equipment and buys directly from farmers; local banks developed new credit schemes for farmers previously deemed too risky to finance; while **Olam** and **USAID** serve as guarantors for the loans opening up a world of financing options to farmers who wished to expand their productivity. To date, more than 8,000 farmers have gone through the **Olam-USAID** training program. Farmers have doubled their productivity and increased their net incomes by 230 percent thanks to better rice yields and higher prices. Even younger generations are becoming interested in farming again.

Action Health Incorporated: AHI is a non-profit organization dedicated to improving the health of Nigerian adolescents. Since 1989, AHI has worked with youths, community leaders, policy makers, parents, state and federal government officials to design and implement innovative and participatory projects in education, healthcare and youth development, providing models that have been adopted and expanded by government and other civil society organizations. With an annual budget of over US \$1,000,000, AHI's work is supported with funds from grants and contract awards from international organizations that include, the Ford Foundation, MacArthur Foundation, International Women's Health Coalition, Packard Foundation, WHO, UNICEF, UNFPA and Futures Group International, amongst others.

Fate Foundation: FATE's Executive Director, Osayi Alile, was previously vice president of Junior Achievement of Nigeria and was named a Young Global Leader in 2007. FATE began a pilot project in 2008 "Fate on wheels", to offer Lagos university students entrepreneurship training, a business plan competition, and microfinance opportunities in advance of graduation, as an intervention responding directly to Nigeria's persistent unemployment and underemployment trend. Their new goal is for FATE-assisted businesses to contribute 3% of GDP, so they are looking for innovative ways to realize this.

Kiwanja.net: Since 2003, kiwanja.net has been helping empower local, national and international non-profit organizations to make better use of information and communications technology in their work. Specializing in the application of mobile technology, it provides a wide range of ICT-related services drawing on over 22 years experience of its founder, Ken Banks. Non-profits in over 40 countries have so far benefited from a range of kiwanja initiatives, including FrontlineSMS and nGOMobile.

Rural Africa Water Development Project (RAWDP): RAWDP was founded in 2000 by Joachim Ezeji. Previously working with Shell Petroleum Development Company, Joachim has effectively piloted the affairs of RAWDP including its work with **African Development Bank, the UN-Habitat, the World Bank** and the Gender and Water Alliance amongst others. The project's mission is to collaborate with relevant local and international groups as well as other stakeholders to bring clean drinking water and improved sanitation to marginalized rural groups especially those living in the environmentally degraded oil producing communities in southeastern Nigeria. Programs are centered on clean water provision, sanitation improvement and hygiene promotion through Research, Networking and Advocacy, Action intervention and Capacity Building. 2008 budget was \$250,000 USD.

Search for Common Ground: The Station is a television drama series created and produced by Common Ground Productions in Lagos, Nigeria, aimed at providing peaceful alternatives to handling conflict and positive role models for Nigerians, especially youth. Developed and written by a team of young Nigerians, The Station addresses issues that have been identified as the main impediments to the country's development, including tribal violence, domestic abuse, corruption, unemployment and HIV/AIDS. Founded in 1982, Search for Common Ground works to transform the way the world deals with conflict by collaborative problem solving. They work with local partners to find culturally appropriate means to strengthen societies' capacity to deal with conflicts constructively: to understand the differences and act on the commonalities.

Benue Swine Improvement Project: In May 2008, the central Nigerian state of Benue began working with Iowa State University's Global Extension program for help with the Benue Swine Improvement Gov. of Benue was interested in working with ISU Extension because of the organization's reputation and as the leading university in research and education in the production of hogs, corn, soybeans and eggs. Funding for the ISU Extension team assistance and training is solely from the Benue State government. The program focuses enhancing the capacity of the Ministry of Agriculture along with training of Benue personnel to increase maize and soybean production, use appropriate mechanization, and bring new swine genetics and artificial insemination to Benue State.

Prospective Partnerships.

Food Security - USAID has set aside \$25M to work with Nigeria on the Global Food Security Response Program. USG is interested in focusing on agricultural productivity as a key engine for growth.

Oil and Gas major players are **Chevron, Schlumberger, Halliburton, ExxonMobil, Shell and Total**, each of which has a Managing Director in Nigeria.

The U.S. Embassy successfully facilitated Delta's direct routes from Atlanta to Lagos and New York's JFK to Lagos. Delta added 777 service in its Atlanta-Lagos route as part of the deal.

Standard Chartered Bank of Nigeria is headed by American citizen Chris Knight.

SOUTH AFRICA

Partnership to Strengthen Laboratory Systems: In a pioneering public-private partnership, PEPFAR and BD (Becton, Dickinson and Company) are supporting the improvement of overall laboratory systems and services in African countries severely affected by HIV/AIDS and tuberculosis. Through this five-year partnership, valued at up to \$18 million, PEPFAR and BD will work on the ground with national reference laboratories, Ministries of Health, and implementing partners to provide direct support to countries to assist with their efforts to strengthen laboratories. This collaboration has targeted Uganda, Mozambique and South Africa, with expansion plans for Côte d'Ivoire, Ethiopia, Kenya, Tanzania, and Malawi.

Grassroot Soccer: Founded by former professional soccer players and a practicing pediatrician, Grassroot Soccer (GRS) trains soccer stars, coaches, teachers, and peer educators in the world's most HIV-affected countries to deliver an interactive HIV prevention and life skills curriculum to youth (aged 10-18) – providing them with the knowledge, skills, and support to remain HIV-free. In addition to the funding received from The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, GRS has received funding from a number of committed individuals and prestigious foundations and corporations including, **Draper Richards Foundation, Thrive Foundation, Byrne Foundation, Kellogg Foundation, DeBeers, Barclays Bank, DaimlerChrysler and Johnson & Johnson.** As of June 2009, GSR has graduated more than 285,000 youth in 13 countries, with long-term follow-up data showing strong behavioral outcomes and marked changes in knowledge and attitudes, including HIV stigma. Through a partnership with PEPFAR's New Partner Initiative, GRS's flagship site in South Africa is in Cape Town, with the goal of educating more than 230,000 youth over a three-year period (2009-2011), using soccer as the universal language.

African Leadership Academy: ALA seeks to transform Africa by developing and supporting future generations of African leaders. Opened in September 2008, ALA brings together the most promising 16-19 year old leaders from all 54 African nations for an innovative two-year program designed to prepare each student for a lifetime of leadership on the continent. Students are selected to attend the Academy based on merit alone and complete an innovative curriculum with a unique focus on leadership, entrepreneurship, and African studies.

HIV/AIDS Awareness Project & Youth Development: HAPYD was established in 2000 to work with HIV-positive children who have lost one or both parents to AIDS. The organization provides families with referrals to counseling and welfare services, emergency food, and transportation costs to and from daycare, and is expanding its programs to include home-based care, income-generation projects and other activities. HAPYD works with Orphans, Vulnerable Children, Child-Headed Households and Parents in Soweto.

International Network of Women's Funds: Based in Cape Town, INWF brings together women's funds from Africa and around the world. This unique network brings funders in both the North and the South are organized democratically, and are organically linked to the feminist movement - from which almost all of them emerged. Currently the INWF has seventeen members committed to expanding the resources available to women's rights organizations around the world: including **Urgent Action Fund for Africa** (based in Kenya),

MaAfrika Tikkun: This non-profit organization's mission is to empower and transform previously disadvantaged South African communities by focusing on vulnerable children, their guardians and environment

achieved by investing in and delivering service excellence in the areas of education, economics, health and social services operating out of community centers. MaAfrika Tikkun uses a “bottoms-up” approach within each community that it operates working extensively with community-based organizations, leaders of the community and members of each community to identify areas of critical need.

Rural Women’s Movement (RWM): The RWM is an independent non-profit rural women’s land rights organization that seeks to eliminate poverty through programs designed to provide training on women’s land and property rights, and enhance women’s participation in local governance. RWM advocates for women’s independent land and property rights and lobbies for public policy changes while also providing training on how to respond strategically to the AIDS pandemic. The organization helps orphaned children to deal with the loss of their parents, and strives to deepen children’s commitment to pro-social values such as personal responsibility, helpfulness, respect for others and kindness – qualities we believe are essential to leading humane and productive lives in a democratic society.

The Leadership and Innovation Network for Collaboration Fellowship: LINC is a multi-year effort to help improve quality and quantity of care for the increasing numbers of orphaned and vulnerable children. In partnership with Convene Venture Philanthropy, the **Synergos Institute**, and the **South African Department of Social Development**, the program created a cross-sector leadership development plan to contribute to improving the quality and quantity of care for children in South Africa. LINC engages senior civil servants of key government departments, heads of the major civil society organizations active for children, directors of corporate responsibility in some of the country’s largest companies, and leading academics, international donors, and community leaders. **Midvaal Children’s Leadership and Innovation Partnership** is an innovative multi-sector local level partnership to develop leadership and care at scale for children in Midvaal, a small municipality south of Johannesburg.

The Community Development Foundation Western Cape: This organization set out to play a mediating and facilitating role by strengthening relationships and building partnerships within communities, with donors and other development players.

Ubuntu Education Fund: This organization’s integrated services are composed of four programs: Empowerment; HIV Prevention Outreach; Clinical; and Care and Support. The Ubuntu Model is a community-based strategy that ensures ownership and sustainability of our educational initiatives. Programs engage in the continued struggle to make the free South Africa a prosperous South Africa for all. Ubuntu provides a continuum of support that follows each child until they themselves become leaders in their community. Initiatives generate a cycle of empowerment in the Port Elizabeth townships, emboldening vulnerable children and their families to lead their communities toward healthy futures.

WHEAT Trust: This organization is committed to grassroots women’s empowerment for community development through education and training. WHEAT awards grants to individual women and women-led community based organizations (CBOs/CSOs) to ensure active participation of women in the development of their respective communities. One of the leading women’s development funds in South Africa, based in Cape Town, Part of **Synergos Grantmakers Leadership Coop**.







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Information Note on the 2009 Forum for the Future

Italy and Morocco are honoured to inform the BMENA, G8 and other Partner Countries as well as international organizations and civil society partners on the preparation of the sixth Forum for the Future to be held in Morocco on 2 and 3 November 2009.

Following the announcement at the Abu Dhabi Forum for the Future (18-19 October 2008), the Italian and Moroccan co-chairs started preparatory consultations with parties involved in the Forum for the Future from both the government and civil society sides. In this process, the two civil society representatives, Organisation Marocaine des Droits Humains (OMDH) and No Peace Without Justice (NPWJ), were given the responsibility to coordinate the participation of the civil society.

The aim of these consultations was to come to an understanding on the policy priorities for the year 2009 and to reach a decision on the organisational modalities (themes, dates and the calendars of the activities programmed for the 2009 FfF).

It has been underlined that the success of the Ministerial meeting of the 2009 FfF will be primarily due to the participation of all the concerned countries (at a Ministerial level) and to its project-based approach. It has been equally recognized the essential contribution of women and youth in political, economic and social development as well as the importance of further encouraging them in particular to participate in all activities taking place in the framework of the FfF.

The Italian and the Moroccan co-chairs underline the opportunity to undertake an evaluation work of our Partnership by engaging in a critical and open assessment of the various initiatives launched since its inception aiming at adapting and improving it, by reinforcing our gains and bringing changes where necessary.

With this in mind, the 2009 *Forum for the Future* hopes to provide a setting for an informal, flexible, open and inclusive dialogue, devoted to strengthening the initially set principles.

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Further to preparatory consultations, the Italian and the Moroccan co-chairs have set up the following calendar of events, on the basis of the policy priorities agreed for the FfF:

Calendar of Events:

The 2009 Fff foresees to reconfirm and reinforce the traditional two segments: the Ministerial Meeting scheduled on November 2 and 3 2009 in Marrakesh -Morocco- and a Sub-Ministerial meeting, to be held in Rome - Italy- on October 23. The Sub-Ministerial meeting will be aimed at finalizing the agenda and the documents for the Ministerial Meeting in Morocco.

The Forum for the Future will be fed by three thematic interrelated workshops aimed at widening the space for discussion and reflection between government and civil society representatives on the selected themes for this year's Forum for the Future.

Conceptual and policy priorities:

The agreed policy priorities for the Fff will be addressed by the three workshops as follows:

- ✓ 1 workshop on : "the impact of the international financial crisis on the BMENA region", to be held in Beirut (Lebanon) on 26th and 27th September 2009. NPWJ will prepare alongside the Lebanese partner-NGOs, the *concept and background paper* to detail the organizational and technical modalities. The Beirut workshop will focus on the challenges which the region has to face in the current systemic economic and financial crisis and the role of governments, civil society and the private sector in addressing them. The workshop aims at discussing those issues related to the role of the corporate social responsibility, transparency and private sector in addressing social justice, unemployment and poverty as well as at discussing strategies which could enable broader development in the region, in the light of the outcomes of the UN conference on the world economic and financial crisis. The discussion will aim at elaborating and proposing new tools and instruments that can help in renewing the linkages between political, economic and social rights-based reform strategies and reinforcing a democratic and open environment for the benefit of the whole society.

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- ✓ 1 workshop on "political reforms and local governance", to be held in Rabat (Morocco) on 5th and 6th October 2009. OMDH and Morocco, as co-chair, will prepare the *concept and background paper* to detail the organisational and technical modalities. The purpose of the Rabat Workshop is to assess issues and initiatives relating to the development of local government in countries of the BMENA region. The workshop will particularly focus on addressing the status and issues of local administrations, and local branches and units of central governments and will aim to analyse and discuss the capacity of local governments to run their affairs and explore the relationship between local administrations and local constituencies.

- ✓ 1 workshop on: "human development and human security", to be held in Qatar between 10 and 14 October 2009 (date ~~to be~~). The Arab Democracy Foundation (ADF), as a partner NGO, will take the lead in preparing the *concept and background paper*.

Invitations to the activities:

The objective of having three regional workshops is to discuss themes of mutual interest by governments and civil society representatives. The Italian and the Moroccan co-chairs invite the Countries participating in the G8-BMENA initiative to participate actively in these workshops as they will feed the parallel civil society forum, the sub-ministerial and the ministerial meetings.

Each participating Government will take charge of the costs of its own delegation to the aforesaid events.





The World over everyone is concerned and deliberating on "The Climate Crises" and its mitigation. We also need to include the voices of the World's poor and also study the coping and mitigation measures adopted by the rural poor, and their future needs. This is essential to make the entire process and the Copenhagen Summit also inclusive of the poor.





Jewish Anger at Obama

When Secretary of State Hillary Clinton addresses some 7,500 delegates to the American Israel Public Affairs Committee's Washington policy conference on Monday morning, the moment will be fraught.

It's just possible that Clinton, accustomed to being love-bombed by the powerful pro-Israel lobby's conventioners whenever she spoke as New York's junior senator, will be greeted with chilly silence or, worse, scattered boos --the AIPAC membership's angry response to the frayed and apparently deteriorating relationship between Israel and the United States.

"Man, I wouldn't want to be Hillary Clinton going there at this point in time," says Manhattan billionaire James S. Tisch, chief executive of Loews Corp. -- the hotel, insurance and oil exploration conglomerate--and a longtime activist in Jewish causes and philanthropies. "I wouldn't be surprised if she gets a 'cold' -- a diplomatic sickness."

"I think this could really be an important point of demarcation for Jewish public opinion of the president," Tisch says.

The 57-year-old Tisch, a big-money political donor who gives to both Democrats and Republicans and supported John McCain in the 2008 presidential election, is typical of wealthy Jewish supporters of Israel, especially in New York, who are bitterly opposed to President Obama's Middle East policies and harshly critical of the officials who are carrying them out.

Tisch was one of a number of Jewish leaders interviewed by the Daily Beast who were angry at Obama -- so much so that they think the issue could affect Jewish donations to Democratic candidates this fall.

But Tisch is unusual in his willingness to air his indignation in public. "I'm outraged, but not surprised," Tisch says about the past week's unpleasantness, in which Vice President Joe Biden was blindsided and embarrassed during his official visit to Israel, when housing authorities there suddenly announced plans for the expansion of U.S.-opposed residential construction in the disputed Arab quarter of East Jerusalem.

Despite Binyamin Netanyahu's sheepish apology and Biden's gracious acceptance, Secretary Clinton phoned the Israeli prime minister last Friday to scorch him for damaging the peace process and Israel's relations with the United

States, and demand that Israel immediately rescind the new construction plans.

White House adviser David Axelrod continued the public thrashing of Israel on last Sunday's Washington talk shows, condemning our historic ally's construction announcement as "an affront" and "an insult" to the United States.

"I don't think he's pro-Israel," Tisch says, voicing the suspicions of many. "I think the president comes to this from Jeremiah Wright's church, and there's no doubt in my mind that in Jeremiah Wright's church, the Palestinians were portrayed as freedom fighters and not as terrorists."

Tisch adds the flap is bound to influence the traditionally Democratic Jewish electorate, nearly 80 percent of which voted for Obama in 2008.

"Now, for the first time, there are a significant number of people in the organized Jewish community that feel that the president has gone too far," Tisch says. It will be interesting to watch "what happens to the president's approval rating among Jewish voters. I think this could really be an important point of demarcation for Jewish public opinion of the president."

Other wealthy Jewish New Yorkers, who are active in the pro-Israel cause as well as Democratic Party politics, agree the issue could depress Jewish support for Democrats next November.

"Obama has done zero favors for the Democratic candidates in 2010," says a prominent Democratic fundraiser who, like most of Jewish activists who spoke for this story, was unwilling to go on the record. "I know a lot of historical Democrats who are big check-writers and even bundlers, who have told me that until things settle down they have no interest in helping any Democrats."

Another politically active Jewish billionaire confirms this assessment. "I think anyone writing a check now is doing it with shaking fingers," this man says. "Not only is Obama changing the nature of our relationship with Israel, he is pushing through health care legislation that will cost everybody more money, he is demonizing Wall Street and the 'big fat cats,' attacking people who gave a lot of money to the Democrats and their candidates for Congress and the presidential race. So this latest thing is the third strike."

A dovish minority approves of Obama's taking Israel to the woodshed. "I am utterly supportive of the president here," Democratic money man Orin Kramer tells The Daily Beast's political reporter, Benjamin Sarlin. "I think the president is on the firmest possible ground."

Former California congressman Mel Levine, an AIPAC board member, seconds Kramer's sentiment, adding that longtime Democrats will remain loyal. "I believe that the donors will overwhelmingly stay with Obama," Levine says. "I fear that our Israeli friends are miscalculating the reaction in the U.S., including among American Jews."

But Abraham Foxman, national director of the influential Anti-Defamation League, is among the Jewish leaders who in the past few days have issued harsh condemnations of the Obama White House. The ADL criticized Obama's "gross overreaction to a point of policy difference among friends," adding that "we are shocked and stunned at the administration's tone and public dressing down of Israel."

"The issue here, for 78 percent of the Jews who voted for Obama, is you condemn your ally and your friend," Foxman says. "But when Syria spits in the president's face by continuing to back Hezbollah, we don't say anything? I think it's nuts."

As for Hillary Clinton, once the darling of the pro-Israel community, "she is just an employee," Foxman says disdainfully. "She is reflecting him."

Los Angeles billionaire and entertainment mogul Haim Saban, who over the past two decades has given tens of millions of dollars to the Democratic Party, says such comments are counterproductive, and counsels all sides to zip their lips.

"I think we should stop talking about this," says Saban, an Egyptian-born Israeli who emigrated to the United States three decades ago.

"It's a crisis. It's a family disagreement between two great friends. Let the powers that be address whatever issues that need to be addressed in private. Israel and the United States are two staunch allies and have been so for sixty-plus years. The relationship is bigger and stronger than any one disagreement or exchange."

Clinton's appointed replacement in the Senate, Kirsten Gillibrand—a member of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, who irked some Jewish Democrats early last year when she seemed to support Obama's use of tough measures to pressure Israel -- this week issued a statement of strong support for the Jewish state and its "unbreakable" bond with America. Gillibrand is campaigning for election his year.

But former Bush administration official Dan Senor, the co-author of a book-length paean to Israeli economic ingenuity, who's been considering jumping into the race as a Republican, sees the current controversy as an opportunity to attract cross-over Democratic support.

James Tisch expresses skepticism that an Israel-focused Senate campaign would work. "If Dan Senor is going to hang his Senate race on this issue, he might as well save everybody the grief and trouble and not run in the first place," Tisch says.

But Senor, who is expected soon to announce whether or not he's a candidate, sees Israel as just one of host of issues on which to base a campaign—including health care, the economy, and taxes.

"Obama's Israel policy is symptomatic of a larger criticism of Obama's foreign policy," says a person familiar with Senor's thinking. "And that is, the president is downgrading our historic alliances while reaching out to our adversaries."

That was certainly not the impression Obama gave to Jewish organizations during the presidential campaign. As the Democratic primary season came to an end, that AIPAC members cheered Clinton when she vouched for Barack Obama's pro-Israel bona fides. When Obama followed her to the podium at the Washington Convention Center, he elicited whoops of joy as he declared the security of the Jewish state "sacrosanct" and "non-negotiable" and added in a burst of mutual adoration: "Jerusalem will remain the capital of Israel and it must remain undivided."

James Tisch, for one, took it with a grain of salt -- and indeed Obama's campaign quickly softened and fuzzed up his red-meat vow to the AIPAC faithful.

"I'm from the 'don't listen to what they say, watch what they do' school of politics," Tisch says. "It's easy in a Senate race or a presidential race to say you're for an undivided Jerusalem, and now Hillary Clinton is going in exactly the opposite direction. Pay close attention to the AIPAC conference. This is coming up at a truly hot time."

In recent weeks, the Obama Administration has endorsed "healthy relations" between Iran and Syria, mildly rebuked Syrian President Bashar Assad for accusing the U.S. of "colonialism," and publicly apologized to Moammar Gadhafi for treating him with less than appropriate deference after the Libyan called for "a jihad" against Switzerland.

When it comes to Israel, however, the Administration has no trouble rising to a high pitch of public indignation. On a visit to Israel last week, Vice President Joe Biden condemned an announcement by a mid-level Israeli official that the government had approved a planning stage—the fourth out of seven required—for the construction of 1,600 housing units in north Jerusalem. Assuming final approval, no ground will be broken on the project for at least three years.

The Obama administration has taken the admonition to "Keep your friends close but your enemies closer" to a new level.

They want to make love with their enemies while taking their friends to the woodshed and beating the living daylights out of them. And take them they did, time after time.

First Biden, then Hillary, then some semi-anonymous character at the State Department dressing down Ambassador Oren (talk about disrespecting your betters!), then on to the talk show circuit with the droning Gibbs and Obama's "best Jew" David Axlerod. Dear TTAB Member:

Congratulations again on being selected as a member of the Travel and Tourism Advisory Board (TTAB). The U.S. Travel Association, whose singular mission is to increase travel to and within the United States, is eager to be a valued resource as you represent the industry's interests. In that spirit, I want to share with you what U.S. Travel considers to be the three immediate opportunities for the TTAB. To assist you in preparing for the meeting on April 8, U.S. Travel is readying a briefing book with more detail on these and other issues affecting our industry. You will receive the briefing materials the first week of April.

Implementing Travel Promotion Act (TPA)

U.S. Travel developed a set of detailed recommendations for those involved in TPA implementation in the areas of strategic priorities, organizational milestones, leadership, funding, success metrics and marketing plans. We have attached them for you in this email. We believe the appointment of a Board of Directors and start-up funding for the Corporation are the two most pressing issues to address with the government at this time. The formation of a Corporation for Travel Promotion and hiring of an Executive Director to oversee its operations cannot move forward without the appointment of a Board of Directors. Therefore, we have urged the Commerce Department to work quickly with the Departments of Homeland Security and State to nominate a Board of Directors and to select individuals who are well respected for their expertise in international marketing by the travel community.

Regarding the funding for TPA, the bill was originally drafted two years ago and was written under the assumption that it would pass before the beginning of Fiscal Year 2010 (Oct 1, 2009). The intent was to have a full year of FY2010 for the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) to implement the fee collection system established by TPA to fund the Corporation's first year. Fiscal Year 2010 is critical because the legislation authorizes \$10 million from the fee to be transferred to the Corporation to hire staff, develop marketing plans and conduct other activities that will ensure the long-term success of the program. However, with six months left in FY 2010, it appears that the rule and implementation of the new fee mechanism will need to be expedited. If a fee is not collected in FY 2010, it will prevent the Corporation from receiving the \$10 million in funding to begin its work and jeopardize the core objective of the bill. Accordingly, it is critical that the Departments of Homeland Security and Commerce work together to expedite the fee rule, loan the Corporation the money in FY10 or inform Congress that a technical correction to the bill is needed in order to secure the \$10 million in start-up costs.

Efficient Air Travel Security Screening

Within the TSA screening process, long lines, occasionally poor customer service and inconsistent policies have frustrated many air travelers over the past several years. TSA has made some efforts to improve the screening process through use of self-select lanes based on a traveler's familiarity with the security process. However, additional efforts to more securely and efficiently process travelers through the TSA screening process must be developed.

U.S. Travel is creating a blue ribbon panel of approximately 20 experts from various organizations and industries to propose a comprehensive screening process that maximizes security and minimizes the burden on travelers. This panel is necessary, in part, because key stakeholders such as airlines and airports and the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) do not have the luxury to build a long-term plan in travelers' best interests in the midst of day-to-day crises. The panel includes experts in aviation security, queuing, technology and privacy, and will solicit the views of frequent travelers who will bring their "road warrior" views to the panel.

The group will bring a "blue sky" approach to the challenge of achieving frictionless security by: (a) thinking beyond what the process looks like today, (b) understanding the dual need for security and efficiency, and (c) evaluating the process and proposals from the eyes of the traveler. The panel will make recommendations after convening during the next several months. These recommendations can become a primary focus of the Travel and Tourism Advisory Board.

Visa Access

Following the terrorist attacks of 9/11, needed reforms to safeguard America's travel systems were instituted across U.S. government departments. The U.S. visa application and review process carried out by the Department of State, for instance, underwent significant security changes including a near 100 percent interview requirement for non-immigrant visa applicants. This concerted effort to safeguard the U.S. visa issuance process, however, was not matched with staffing, resources, technology or new programs to ensure the continued timely and efficient processing of visa applications. U.S. Travel recommends dedicating new staff resources to countries targeted as emerging markets such as Brazil, China and India in order to meet the visa processing demands we know exist there. We also believe it is critical that the State Department explore creative technology solutions, such as videoconferencing technology for visa interviews, that will improve access to U.S. Consulates for travelers in geographically large countries.

On behalf of the entire travel industry, thank you for your willingness to take time from your busy schedule to represent our industry's views to our federal leaders. Speaking with one voice will help focus policymakers on the issues that will present the best opportunities to help the travel community address our critical needs during these challenging times.







The allegation against Nobel laureate Muhammad Yunus of 'diverting foreign aid from Grameen Bank to another company' should be investigated, the prime minister

has said.

"Bangladesh has set many examples. Deceiving people by siphoning off their money is another such example. This is nothing but sucking out money from the people after giving them loans," she said replying to questions from journalists on Sunday.

"There has been no improvement in the lifestyle of the poor so far. They were just used as pawns to get more aids," Hasina added.

She was speaking at a press conference at her office on Sunday following her three-nation tour of Russia, Belgium and Japan.

"The people of Bangladesh have been made guinea pigs I have never supported that. And now I protest," Hasina told journalists.

Naimul Islam Khan, editor of Amader Shomoy, said, "Initially, the government had 60 percent share of the Grameen Bank which now has shrunk to 25 percent. It seems Mr Yunus wanted to empty the government exchequer, if he could. The government, however, didn't let that happen."

He also asked whether the government would investigate the allegation raised against Yunus and his Grameen Bank.

Responding to the query, the prime minister said, "Grameen Bank had been grabbed in such a manner as if it's a personal property. This should also be investigated. The poor people are becoming paupers. They have been tricked by sweet talks. Finally, things are getting out."

Hasina compared Khaleda Zia's 'affection' for her cantonment house with Yunus' 'affection' for his Grameen Bank and said, "Grameen Bank is a public property. But it's being privatised out of 'love'. Yunus Sahib has fallen in love with Grameen Bank.

"One can't but get caught if play with the money of the poor," she added.

Norway's national TV NRK aired a documentary on November 30 titled "Fanget i Mikrogjeld" or "Caught in Micro debt", based on which

bdnews24.com ran a report on December 1.

According to the documentary, Yunus transferred the money to Grameen Kalyan, which was in no way involved with microcredit operations.

Responding to the allegations, Grameen Bank claimed there was no wrongdoing in the agreement between the bank and Grameen Kalyan under which it received Tk 3,917 million from the bank.

"Decisions were taken by the Grameen Bank Board, with due deliberation, good faith, and with good intentions to benefit the poor," the Grameen Bank rejoinder said.
